WHEREAS said proposed vacation was submitted to and acted upon by the Planning Commission of the City of Riverside and notice of hearing said resolution was given as provided by said Public Streets, Highways, and Service Easements Vacation Law; and

WHEREAS on the day fixed for the hearing the City Council heard and found and hereby finds from all of the evidence submitted that the portion of Brooks Street ordered vacated is unnecessary for present or prospective public use;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Riverside, California, that the portion of Brooks 2 3

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Street in the City of Riverside, County of Riverside, State of California, described in the document attached hereto, marked Exhibit A, and by this reference made a part hereof, be and the same is hereby vacated.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the vacation shall occur only after the applicable conditions contained in the Planning Department's report to the legislative body dated October 10, 1986, and on file with the City Clerk have been satisfied; and the City Clerk is hereby directed not to record this resolution of vacation until the applicable conditions have been satisfied.

COMMENCING at the most Westerly corner of Lot 77 of said Cuttle and Wilson's Subdivision;

THENCE S. 60° 19'58" E., along the Southwesterly line of said Lot 77, a distance of 21.12 feet to the TRUE POINT OF BEGINNING;

THENCE continuing S. 60° 19'58" E., along the Southwesterly line of Lots 77 through 79 and the Northeasterly prolongation thereof, of said map of Cuttle and Wilson's Subdivision, a distance of 181.87 feet to a point in the centerline of the Union Pacific Railroad tracks; said point being in a non-tangent curve concave Northwesterly and having a radius of 3,274.17 feet; the radial line to said point bears S. 50° 03'45" E.;


