Upon the expiration or revocation, Permittee shall, within the time prescribed by the City, remove all improvements or obstructions placed, constructed or maintained by the Permittee. If the Permittee fails to abide by the removal order of the City within the time prescribed, the City shall have the right to remove and destroy the improvements without reimbursement to the Permittee and the cost of such removal shall be paid by the Permittee to the City of Riverside and shall constitute a debt owed to the City of Riverside.
- 4. Permittee, by acceptance hereof, waives the right of claim, loss, damage or action against the City of Riverside arising out of or resulting from revocation, termination, removal of the improvements or any action of the City of Riverside, its officers, agents or employees taken in accordance with the terms hereof.
- 5. Finding and determination by the City Council of the City of Riverside that the Permittee, or his heirs and assigns or successors in interest, are in default of the terms hereunder shall be cause for revocation.
- 6. Permittee herewith agrees to hold the City of Riverside harmless from and against all claims, demands, costs, losses, damages, injuries, action for damages and/or injuries, and liability growing or arising out of or in connection with the construction, encroachment, and/or maintenance to be done by Permittee or his agents, employees or contractors within the described property.




MULTI MODAL TRANSPORTATION CENTER

By encroachment permit dated July 22, 1983, the City of Riverside authorized four newspaper publishers, namely, USA Today, the Press Enterprise, the Los Angeles Times, and the Santa Ana Register, to install newspaper racks on the porch in front of the Multi Modal Transportation Center, located at 3911 University Avenue in Riverside.

You recently advised me that you have received a request from the Sun Telegram in San Bernardino for a similar installation. I concur in their request and would recommend that you prepare a similar permit. May I also suggest that this permit also include three additional newspapers which have installed racks at the center, namely, Community Rentals and Homes for Sale, Voice, and the Los Angeles Herald. This permit should contain a statement that the racks, which have yet to be installed by the Sun Telegram, must be the exact same style and color as the seven existing racks which have already been installed.
