Narrative:

On Monday, 02-20-17, at 2342 hours, I was notified by Officer D. Smith via text message that we (SWAT) had been activated reference an Officer Involved Shooting where the suspect was outstanding. After being notified I went to Riverside Police Department's Aviation Hangar and picked up our SWAT equipment truck. I then drove the vehicle to the pre designated command post located at Garfield Ave and Van Buren Blvd. and arrived at about 0030 hours (02-21-17).

I waited at the scene until I located Sgt. Corbett on Garfield Ave east of Van Buren Blvd. It was decided that some SWAT officers respond to the cul-de sac of Sage Ave where a blood trail was located. We arrived to the location and met up with Sgt. Ortiz and other officers who were positioned across the street from [REDACTED] Sgt. Ortiz advised that he and several officers followed a blood trail to the driveway area of the property, but did not go any further do to officer safety reasons. Possibly due to Sgt. Ortiz's positioning, he was unable to safely verify the addresses of where the blood trail was located. Sgt. Ortiz also advised no contact was made with anyone at either residence. We confirmed one of the addresses and told Sgt. Corbett that no contact was made with the occupants of [REDACTED]

Sgt. Ortiz coordinated phone contact with the occupants of [REDACTED] and advised us that several people were going to exit. Minutes later, about a dozen subjects exited [REDACTED] I provided the residents protection as they exited and escorted them to the front of the driveway where Sgt. Ortiz and his assisting officers took them away from the residence for safety.

While escorting some of the occupants of [REDACTED] several subjects exited the east residence on the property [REDACTED] I heard SWAT officers yelling commands at the subjects. The Armored Rescue Vehicle (ARV) was driven up the driveway of the property to provide protection for SWAT officers and any other possible residents adjacent to the east portion of the location.

Once we believed everyone was out of [REDACTED] Sgt. Corbett, Officer Soria, Officer Smith and I cleared the residence of any additional occupants. Officer Smith and I remained inside the living room of the location and maintained observation of the west side of [REDACTED] Officer Smith and I held the location for several hours.

At about 0646 hours, Officer Smith was tasked with porting windows of [REDACTED] I assisted Officer Smith by providing him cover while he completed the operation.

At about 0700 hours, we were advised that a tactical plan was developed to introduce chemical agent(s) into [REDACTED] where the suspect was believed to be held up. At about 0703 hours, Officer Allison was tasked with throwing a 'burn safe' filled with

1 chemical agent(s) into [REDACTED] See his report for details. I assisted Officer
2 Allison with providing him with cover as the plan was completed. Upon completion of
3 the plan, I returned to the backyard of [REDACTED] and assisted with containment
4 with Officers Degruy, Allison and Smith. Shortly after the chemical agent plan in its
5 entirety was completed; Officers on the opposing side of [REDACTED] broadcasted
6 that a fire had started on the "4 side" of the residence. Immediately after, I saw smoke
7 billowing from the north/east roof of the location.

9 I remained at the same location until Officer Smith advised our assistance was possibly
10 needed to the front of the residences. I cleared [REDACTED] and met with other
11 SWAT officers in the driveway of the property where the ARV was positioned.

12
13 Several Officers were at the ARV using fire hoses attempting to put out the fire and
14 preventing other structures from catching fire. I assisted by providing them cover.
15 Minutes later, Riverside Fire personnel arrived and took over the firefighting efforts.

17 We were later released from the scene by Sgt. Corbett.
