664/187 PC / Attempted Murder of a Police Officer

K. Wilder #1629

1 Narrative:

2 On 02/20/17 at approximately 2345 hours, I was notified by the Riverside Police Department dispatch  
3 center of an officer involved shooting and a full SWAT call out had been initiated. I responded to the area  
4 of Garfield and Van Buren Ave regarding the incident. It was at the scene that I learned that a suspect had  
5 fired shots at two Riverside Police officers and had fled the area. Additional members of patrol believed  
6 the suspect may have fled to [REDACTED]  
7

8 I was assigned as a containment unit along with Officer Degruy, Officer Elliott and Officer Newton for  
9 the initial approach to the residence. At this time I was assigned to a black and white patrol vehicle and  
10 we were to follow the armored vehicle to [REDACTED] While to the front of the residence, Officer  
11 Newton and I were instructed to hold lethal cover on the residence to the south east of [REDACTED]  
12 from behind the armored vehicle's passenger door. At one point SWAT members saw a subject run into  
13 the residence of [REDACTED] and the armored vehicle was moved into the driveway of [REDACTED]  
14 While in the driveway of Sage Ave, I assumed lethal cover on the driver's side of the armored vehicle and  
15 was assigned to cover the west side of the residence. After approximately 30 minutes, Officer Newton  
16 relieved me and I stood behind him while he provided lethal cover on the west side of the residence. We  
17 switched a number of times around 30 minute increments. At one point, Officer Kerr relieved Officer  
18 Newton and after about 30 minutes I relieved Officer Kerr.

20 At one point, the decision was made to deploy a throw phone through the second story loft window on the  
21 south side of the residence. I was assigned to throw the phone through the window which had been broken  
22 by a different member of the SWAT team. A throw phone team was assembled and we approached the  
23 residence. We moved within several feet of the house and the window was now about ten feet above me  
24 and the house was about three feet away. I threw the phone which hit the side of the house and was  
25 unsuccessful. I attempted to throw the phone again which was unsuccessful. On the third throw, I was  
26 able to deploy the phone successfully through the window and the team moved back to the rear of the  
27 armored vehicle.

29 After the throw phone deployment, I relieved Officer Glover who was in the turret of the armored vehicle  
30 holding cover on the second story window. I remained in the position for approximately thirty minutes  
31 until relieved by Officer Wright. I then sat inside of the armored vehicle and relieved Officer Wright after  
32 approximately thirty minutes. At this time, the decision to deploy chemical agents was made and I  
33 retrieved my gas mask and donned it. I returned to my position within the turret and maintained lethal  
34 cover while the chemical agent mission was conducted. Shortly after the deployment, I could see smoke  
35 billow on the north east side of the house and members of the chemical agent mission advised that a fire  
36 had started. I remained in the turret while other members of the SWAT team began fighting the fire. After  
37 approximately 45 minutes, Officer Elliott relieved me and I assisted in using a fire hose to fight the fire.  
38 I was using a hose on the south side of the residence and concentrated water on the eaves and second story  
39 window as well as the roof. I was then relieved by firefighter from the Riverside Fire Department and I  
40 provided lethal cover until relieved from the scene at approximately 1145 hours.
