Narrative

On 02-20-17 at approximately 2330 hrs I was called out to assist at this Incident. Upon arrival I was briefed by Det. Rick Cobb, who was assigned as the case agent. Det. Cobb asked me to respond to the Magnolia Police Station and chart the weapons of the involved officers, V1 Officer Carmona and V2 Officer Espinoza. I went to the station and was assisted by Evidence Tech McKay-Davis. Evidence Tech McKay-Davis photographed both officers and their weapons.

Officer Carmona

Primary – Springfield, Model 1911, .45 caliber, semi-automatic pistol Ser# [REDACTED]
Back up - Smith and Wesson, .38 caliber, Air Weight Model 442, revolver Ser# [REDACTED]

Officer Carmona was in full Riverside Police uniform complete with a duty belt. His primary weapon was a Springfield, Model 1911, .45 caliber, semi-automatic pistol and he carried four extra magazines on his belt. One magazine was loaded into the weapon and it was fully loaded with (8) live rounds and a live round was in the chamber for a total of (9) rounds. He had another magazine for the gun in his left front pants pocket which contained (4) live rounds. He had two extra magazines on his duty belt which were fully loaded with (8) rounds each. His gun was equipped with a tactical light. Officer Carmona told me that a fifth magazine of his was still at the scene.

Officer Carmona carried a back-up weapon which is a .38 caliber, five shot, revolver. This weapon was not fired and was found to be fully loaded.

Officer Espinoza

Primary – Glock, Model 22, .40 caliber, semi-automatic pistol, Ser# [REDACTED]
Back up – Smith and Wesson, Air weight model 442, revolver, Ser# [REDACTED]

Officer Espinoza was in full Riverside Police uniform complete with duty belt. His primary weapon was a Glock, Model 22, .40 caliber, semi-automatic pistol and he carried three spare magazines. The magazine in his weapon at charting was fully loaded with (15) live rounds and one round was in the chamber for a total of (16) rounds. He had a spare magazine on his duty belt which was fully loaded with (15) rounds. His gun was equipped with a tactical light. Officer Espinoza told me that two more magazines of his were at the scene.

Officer Espinoza carried a back-up weapon which is a .38 caliber, five shot, revolver. This weapon was not fired and was found to be fully loaded.

Both officer's primary weapons and the magazines that were in them were collected as evidence. Officer Carmona's spare magazine which contained (4) rounds was also collected. Sgt. T. Banks assigned replacement weapons to both officers. NFD
