10 **Investigation:**

11 On February 22, 2017 I attended the autopsy for the body located inside a bath tub of the
12 burned residence at [REDACTED] on February 21, 2017. It is thought the body is that of
13 S/Marcelino Garcia, due to information learned during the investigation and tattoos located on it
14 but no firm identification had been made at the time of this procedure.
15

16 The autopsy began at 0915 hrs and ended at 1111 hrs. Dr. Fajardo was the lead doctor for the
17 procedure and he was assisted by members of the Coroner staff. Dr. Fajardo began by
18 breaking the seal on the body bag and observing its contents. Inside the bag was a second
19 bag that had been zippered around the body. Upon removing the second bag, I saw the body
20 was that of a male and it had very little clothing on it. There was a pair of burned checkered
21 boxers under the buttocks area, at least one t-shirt on the upper chest area (appearing to have
22 been burnt) and black socks and dark colored shoes on both feet. The right shoe appeared to
23 have duct tape wrapped around the top of it. All clothing and an ear ring were taken as
24 evidence.

26 The body showed signs of burning around the head, face and upper torso areas. Both arms
27 were drawn up to the chest and severely burnt. Both hands were badly burned exposing bone
28 on most of the fingers. The thumb and index finger of the left hand were removed in an effort to
29 obtain prints for identification.
30

31 The body was cleaned so as to reveal tattoos. I observed an "Inland Empire" tattooed to the
32 upper right side of the chest, script writing circling the neck from shoulder to shoulder and
33 "Arlanza" tattooed on the outer right calf. These tattoos appeared to match those known to
34 belong to S/Garcia.

36 Dr. Fajardo located several holes in the body that appeared to be gunshot wounds. They were
37 as follows:

- 38 - Two holes in the top of the right foot
- 39 - Two holes in the left shoulder (superficial in nature)
- 40 - One hole in the upper left chest (no exit wound)

41 Dr. Fajardo probed the holes and photos were taken to show their path and angle. A largely
42 intact projectile was located in the torso and is believed to be from the gunshot wound in the
43 chest. The projectile appeared to be similar to a 9mm copper jacketed round. The round was
44 taken as evidence.

Riverside Police Department
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1 The gunshot wound in the chest appeared to have struck the bottom of the heart causing a
2 significant hole in it. Dr. Fajardo felt this would have been a fatal wound and death would have
3 come very quickly as a result. Once the autopsy was completed, ID Tech Lane took custody of
4 the various evidence items removed from the body by Dr. Fajardo.
