1 **BACKGROUND/SOURCE:**

2 I am a Detective with the Riverside Police Department assigned to the Centralized Investigations
3 Bureau Persons Unit. I responded to 5200 Arlington Avenue to assist with the investigation of an
4 Officer Involved Shooting (OIS) that occurred on Arlington Avenue west of Streeter Avenue, in the
5 City and County of Riverside. I arrived at the command post at 2150 hours. I was assigned as the
6 case agent and Detective Tillett was assigned as the co-case agent.

7
8 **INVESTIGATION:**

9 **Interview of Riverside Police Department Officer William McGuigan (ID# 1829)**

10 On 07-23-18 at 1419 hours, partner Detective Tillett and I interviewed Officer McGuigan in the
11 conference room at Magnolia Police Station. Attorney S. Ethir, Riverside County Deputy District
12 Attorney S. Shouka, and Riverside County District Attorney Investigator J. Campos were also
13 present. The interview was audio recorded on my department issued digital recorder and
14 downloaded into records. Detective Tillett and Attorney S. Ethir also recorded the interview. The
15 following is a summary of the interview.

16
17 Officer McGuigan told us his identification number was #1829. He said on 7/20/18 he was working
18 overtime at the Galleria at Tyler mall. He was wearing a standard class B uniform and was driving
19 a marked Ford Explorer, unit #3519.

20
21 He was patrolling at the Galleria when he heard radio traffic from Air 1 about a pursuit from the 215
22 freeway to Van Buren. Shots were fired at officers from the suspect vehicle. Officer McGuigan
23 drove toward Van Buren from the mall and continued listening to the radio traffic about the pursuit.
24 He drove on Van Buren toward Citrus Heights and heard the suspect was on Van Buren and
25 passed Mockingbird Canyon. He saw the suspect vehicle pass and saw multiple outside agencies
26 following. He saw Hemet Police Department, California Highway Patrol and Riverside Sheriff's
27 Office units in the pursuit. He heard on the radio they wanted Riverside Police Department to take
28 over the pursuit. He didn't see any Riverside Police Department units and entered the pursuit
29 between Citrus Heights and Canyon Ridge. He was behind multiple units.

1 Officer McGuigan knew the suspect vehicle was a light color Chrysler. He saw one car being
2 chased by police units. The suspect was driving fast and the suspect vehicle was "flying." He used
3 an opening in the divider on westbound Van Buren to make a U-turn and join the pursuit. He was
4 behind a Riverside Sheriff's Office Explorer.

5
6 Just before they reached Dufferin, Riverside Sheriff's Office units dropped out of the pursuit.
7 Officer McGuigan moved up and saw he was behind a Riverside Police Department's Sergeant's
8 unit. He could not recall all of the streets they drove on, but they were eastbound Dufferin. He said
9 he tried to watch his unit's COBAN video to look at the streets, but was unable to access it.

10
11 He knew from the radio traffic from Air 1 the suspect was driving in excess of 100 mph. He knew
12 the suspect drove westbound Victoria in eastbound lanes. No units followed the suspect vehicle,
13 but rather paralleled it. The suspect ran multiple stop signs. The suspect did not stop and when the
14 following units slowed to clear the intersections, the suspect vehicle pulled ahead. The suspect
15 ran traffic lights on Indiana and went into opposing traffic on Indiana. Traffic stopped for him at the
16 intersection of Indiana/Van Buren. The units had to go into opposing lanes to avoid the stopped
17 cars. He mentioned Indiana/Van Buren was a large intersection.

18
19 He said the information broadcast meant to him the suspect had no regard for public safety or the
20 safety of officers. The suspect was determined to get away. The pursuit terminated at
21 Arlington/Streeter. They were pursuing him in the area of El Molino; right before Arlington/Streeter.
22 Officer McGuigan was the third car back. The suspect drove westbound back toward Streeter on
23 Arlington.

24
25 Air 1 advised the units there were a bunch of cars in the roadway in the eastbound lanes of
26 Arlington and the suspect was driving westbound in the eastbound lanes. Air 1 anticipated the
27 suspect would ram cars because he had nowhere to go. Officer McGuigan thought the suspect
28 would run or jump into someone else's car and he believed the suspect was armed.

1 Two units stayed on the westbound side of Arlington. The Sergeant moved into the eastbound
2 side going westbound. Officer McGuigan moved to the Sergeant's left in the eastbound lanes.
3 Officer McGuigan stopped to the left and behind the Sergeant's stopped unit.
4

5 As soon as the suspect rammed another car, Officer McGuigan exited his car and ran toward the
6 suspect's car. He could see the suspect's vehicle was pinned up against another car and could
7 not continue moving forward. He ran up to a Camry and used it for cover. As he exited and was
8 about twenty feet from the Camry, he saw officers moving from the street pocket area of
9 California/Arlington (to the front of Del Taco). They were running toward where the suspect vehicle
10 was stopped. As he was running, he heard one shot fired and from his training and experience, he
11 recognized the shot was a rifle shot. At the Camry, he saw Officer O'Farrell with a rifle and did not
12 see anyone else with a rifle. He heard officers giving multiple commands for the suspect to show
13 his hands.
14

15 Officer McGuigan was over the hood area of the Camry and saw two women inside it. He yelled at
16 them to stay down. The other officers were focused on the suspect and he was concerned about
17 the women. He moved around the car to get them out. Officer Hernandez and someone else
18 moved the women from the car. He saw there were about ten officers on the Camry covering the
19 suspect vehicle and moved away to find work elsewhere. He helped set the perimeter and assisted
20 with moving cars out of the way.
21

22 He said the women in the car were crying and terrified. He told them to stay down and to stay low.
23 They didn't have the ability to move themselves out of the car. One fell and another officer had to
24 carry one of them away from their vehicle. He saw other people in their cars. They were hunkered
25 down because they didn't know what was going on. They were scared and saw many cops. He
26 saw people gathering in the Del Taco parking lot and the Sear's parking lot. He said his concern
27 was for the civilians because he knew the suspect was armed and shot at officers.

- 3 he was not as close to the Camry as he originally thought.
