18 Q1: Uh, Detective Adrian Tillett.

20 Q2: Saku Ethir, um, representing Officer O'Farrell.

22 Q3: DA Sam Shouka.

24 Q4: James Campos, Investigator Riverside DA's Office.

25
26 A: And Officer Jared O'Farrell.

27
28 Q: So, this is a criminal report and the report will be submitted to the DA's
29 office. Um, you do not have to speak with me. And if you decide not to speak
30 with me there's no discipline that can come to you for not speaking.

32 A: Okay.

33
34 Q: Um, prior to this interview has anyone ordered you to give a statement?

36 A: No.

38 Q: Other than the public safety statement.

40 A: Right.

42 Q: Has anyone ordered you to speak with me?

44 A: No.

46 Q: Or Adrian or anyone in our unit?
47
48 A: No.
49
50 Q: Okay. Um, and do you wish to speak to me?
51
52 A: Yes.
53
54 Q: Okay. You said your name. What's your ID number?
55
56 A: 1749.
57
58 Q: And how many years have you been with us?
59
60 A: Uh, December will make six years, so five and some change.
61
62 Q: And is this your first department?
63
64 A: Yes.
65
66 Q: And what's your current assignment?
67
68 A: I'm currently assigned to the East NPC as a POP officer.
69
70 Q: And that is - is that pretty new?
71
72 A: I've been there for about a year now.
73
74 Q: Oh.
75
76 A: Yeah just over a year.
77
78 Q: I'm behind. And what's your call sign?
79
80 A: Uh, Paul 29.
81
82 Q: And on the 20th of, um, July this year were you riding with a partner?
83
84 A: No I was by myself.
85
86 Q: Okay. Could you describe your uniform that day?
87
88 A: Uh, yes I was wearing a, um, the all black, uh, traditional POP uniform. Um,
89 with a outer carrier vest, uh, ballistic vest and, uh, BDU pants. Um, my vest is
90 marked with police and a, uh, cloth badge as well on the back. Also has a

91 large police patch.

92

93 Q: Okay. And were you driving a unit that day?

94

95 A: Yes.

96

97 Q: Is it a marked unit?

98

99 A: Yes.

100

101 Q: Is it an Explorer or Crown Vic?

102

103 A: Crown Vic.

104

105 Q: Do you know the unit number?

106

107 A: 3135.

108

109 Q: And were you wearing a body camera?

110

111 A: Yes.

112

113 Q: And did you activate it?

114

115 A: Yes I did.

116

117 Q: Okay. And did you have a chance to review your audio and video from that
118 body cam?

119

120 A: Yes I did.

121

122 Q: Okay. So what we want you to do is start from the beginning of that day, how
123 you got involved in the incident, how you heard about it, what was going on,
124 how you, um, like you would write your police report from beginning to end
125 as much details as you can remember and provide.

126

127 A: Okay.

128

129 Q: And then once you're done, we'll - if we have questions we'll go back and ask
130 you questions.

131

132 A: Okay.

133

134 Q: Okay?

135

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136 A: Sounds good. Um...

137

138 Q2: The only thing real quick, um, I know we went over what we reviewed. Um,
139 the only thing we didn't review and it's okay, but I - I want to make sure that
140 it's on the record is, uh, Officer O'Farrell believes that his (coban) on his
141 Crown Vic, um, should have captured, um, his involvement in, um,
142 essentially, um, following, uh, f- the trail of the vehicle or his attempts within
143 the city limits to try and, you know, uh, trail the pursuit. Um, and then
144 potentially would've captured the termination of the pursuit and, um, the
145 suspect's vehicle as well as potentially, um, his involvement after the pursuit
146 terminated. Um, that video we have not seen. Um, we did watch his (coban),
147 uh, I'm sorry, his body camera video which in looking at the body camera
148 video you can see the (coban), what the (coban) should've captured up in the
149 right I think hand corner. So it looks like something was potentially captured.
150 Um, but he has not reviewed that so certainly I - I want it on the record that,
151 um, the statement he's providing to you, and we understand that it is being
152 done so voluntarily, um, is based on his independent recollection today. Um,
153 but also, um, his, uh, recollection based on what he saw in the (coban) video
154 and the Air 1 video, which he saw as well. But not based on the (coban) video
155 so that's it.

156

157 Q: And do you feel comfortable proceeding with your statement without seeing
158 that?

159

160 A: Yes, I do.

161

162 Q: Okay.

163

164 Q3: Can I ask is that because the (coban) with having issues with downloading it
165 or what happened?

166

167 Q: Yes, all of the units were not - the - from the cars have...

168

169 Q2: Yeah.

170

171 Q: ...weren't - they weren't uploaded. So they are working on that right now.

172

173 Q3: Because of an IT issue?

174

175 Q: Yes.

176

177 Q3: Okay.

178

179 Q2: Yeah. And I - we've had that before so I - I get it. Sometimes it takes longer to
180 have those uploaded or downloaded, whatever we say. And he's comfortable.

181 I just want to make sure that we did review video but we did not review that
182 (coban) and it certainly may have captured things that his (coban) - I'm sorry,
183 his body camera did not capture. So.

185 Q: Okay.

186
187 Q2: That's it.

188
189 A: Okay.

190
191 Q: Okay. Go ahead.

192
193 A: Okay. So, um, on Friday the 20th I was, uh, in the area of University and
194 Iowa. Um, I heard the Channel 1 dispatcher broadcast that, uh, Hemet Police
195 were in a vehicle pursuit, uh, with a suspect who was, uh, shooting at them.
196 Um, they said that they were at the 215 Northbound at Nuevo. So I - from
197 knowing that area I knew that that was coming towards our city. Um, I knew
198 that there was a, uh, like a delay between dispatch getting that info and
199 relaying it to us on patrol. So I used my, um, handheld radio. I went to their
200 frequency to get better live updates to, um, for officer safety reasons on where
201 this guy was gonna be at. Um, at that time I heard that, um, Air 1 was en
202 route. Um, at the same time I also heard that they were, uh, getting off at Van
203 Buren, um, at the 215. Um, I heard over the radio from the people involved in
204 the pursuit at the time that there was, um, more shots fired at them in that area
205 by the suspect. Um, they proceeded westbound on Van Buren from the 215
206 freeway and this time I turned around and was trying to make my way back,
207 um, to the area, like to go down, uh, well my goal was to go down to Victoria
208 and shoot down Victoria and attempt to, uh, get in the area to assist these
209 officers since they were in our city. Um, believe it was Sergeant Elliott who
210 said over the radio that, um, if they were in a position to take over, uh, the
211 pursuit, to assist Hemet because they were in our jurisdiction. So I, uh, lights
212 and sirens, uh, code 3. I went down, um, see I went Canyon Crest, Alessandro,
213 to Arlington to Victoria was my route. Uh, went down Victoria. Um, I heard
214 during this - during this time on my way down to this, um, to that area that he
215 had been, you know, driving on the wrong side of the road, um, speeds were
216 in excess of 100 miles an hour at some point. Um, as I got to the ar - I believe
217 it was about Victoria and I would say Mary area, I, um, based on the situation,
218 this - the suspect was actively shooting at the police officers, um, I knew that
219 at some point when this ended it could, um, potentially be, um, bad for
220 anybody involved, civilians, police officers, whatever. I knew that my rifle
221 was in the trunk of my car. Um, so I pulled over, uh, at that point to get my
222 rifle. Um, to have it up ready with me in my vehicle just in case, um,
223 something like that were to be needed. So I pulled over, got my rifle out. Um,
224 put it in the car with me. And then I continued down Victoria. Um, I got to the
225 area of Victoria and, sorry, Victoria and Van Buren and I had heard the - this

226 time we were all on the same channel. We were on - I believe it was our - our
227 PD Channel 1. Um, the pursuit had gone up in the area of like I believe
228 Cleveland, Duffrin, I'm not, um, yeah Duffrin, Jackson in that loop right
229 there. Um, and so by the time I got to the intersection of Van Buren, it
230 sounded like the suspect was comin' out back towards Van Buren. So myself
231 and there was a - some other officers in that intersection, we'd stopped there.
232 Um, I had just in, you know, waitin' to see if he was gonna come that way. I
233 didn't want to cross paths with this guy if he was actively shooting at the
234 police. Um, so I got out of my car there. Uh, there were some civilians that
235 were, um, either walking or running in that area, working out. So I just
236 directed them to get out of the area just in case, um, he were to come through
237 there shooting. Um, sounded like the suspect continued across Van Buren and
238 didn't come out way. I'm not sure what street he was at that time, um, but I
239 know he went down to believe it was Harrison. So we crossed Van Buren,
240 code 3 again, and, uh, there was a ton of officers in this pursuit so I wasn't
241 acti- actively in the pursuit but I was kind of just trying to be in the area of
242 wherever it was going to end. Um, still the suspect was driving, um, extremely
243 fast. I believe it was broadcasted that he was still over 100 miles an hour at
244 some points through those neighborhoods. Um, so I kind of - I just followed
245 behind with the other officers. He went up to, um, believe it was Harrison to
246 Indiana and eastbound Indiana. Um, that point I kind of just - I was kind of - I
247 was following behind, um, at that time. And then I cut off at Van Buren
248 because he had gone - he had turned I believe it was northbound on either
249 Monroe or Adams. Um, off that way. So I went up Van Buren to Magnolia.
250 Um, I went Van Buren to eastbound Magnolia to northbound Monroe to
251 California. And I had heard, uh, Air 1 was dispatching - er, broadcasting that
252 he had gone up to the area of like, um, be like Sierra and Arch and that
253 neighborhood there. So I was just listening to the radio, tryin' to see, you
254 know, where this guy was gonna go. Um, as I'm continuing up I turn onto
255 California, which I went, uh, California eastbound towards I guess that would
256 be eastbound towards Arlington. Um, this time as I was approaching
257 Arlington, Air 1 had broadcast that the, uh, suspect vehicle was westbound
258 Arlington from Madison, but he was in the eastbound lanes. And if you're
259 familiar with that intersection - er, that area there's a raised center median so
260 he was going against traffic, head on with cars. Um, based on just being in
261 that area at the time, I noticed that there was a ton of civilians out, um, driving
262 their cars. There was - the intersections were packed with people. Um, as I
263 came up to the actual intersection there's a cutout that goes from northbound
264 California to eastbound Arlington, it's kind of out, um, by itself almost like a
265 mini frontage road. Um, so I pulled into that. And, uh, I could hear, uh, at that
266 time I knew he was - if he was coming from Madison I knew he had to be like
267 right there at the time, uh, that I was there. So I stopped. I had shut my, um,
268 my overhead lights off because I knew that if he's shooting at police that I
269 don't want to make myself even more of a target and draw more attention to
270 me. So I, uh, shut down the lights and I was sitting there waiting. I was real

271 quick, um, and then I realized okay he's here right now. He's coming. Um, I
272 looked at my left at the cars that were - would've been going eastbound
273 Arlington, and they were all stopped, pretty much blocking every lane. Um,
274 they were all piled up right there. I think they noticed that there was
275 somebody coming head on with them. Excuse me. Um, at that time he was - I
276 had eyes on the car. I'd - I'd already known that it was, um, probably
277 should've said that earlier but I knew it was a, um, silver, um, Sebring or
278 Chrysler. Um, I could see him comin' just like Air 1 had described, uh,
279 westbound in the eastbound lanes. And he was - if I were to guess his speed, I
280 would say maybe about 50 to 60 miles an hour at the time. Um, and like I said
281 all those cars were stopped right there. Um, just - they were just past the
282 intersection so it would've given him nowhere to go. And I - where I was
283 positioned, um, I was blocking the other, uh, way if he were to come try to
284 turn towards me and exit that way. Knowing that he had, uh, already been
285 firing at police officers, um, throughout this pursuit, um, I - in my mindset at
286 the time I was, um, as soon as I saw him I couldn't really see the details of
287 him. I could see like the silhouette of maybe like his head. Um, I was
288 completely worried at that time that he was gonna start, because I was sitting
289 there and I was pretty much the only way - I was the only officer right there at
290 that intersection at the time, um, I was waiting to just start getting shot at, at
291 that point. Um, I - like I said earlier I had my rifle on my, uh, with me on my
292 passenger seat. And so I had pulled it up at that time. Um, he had - as he came
293 up in front of me I - I would guess maybe 20 yards or so ahead of me, um,
294 knowing that he was coming towards all these civilians that were stopped in
295 the way with nowhere to go, um, the fact that he had already been shooting at
296 police officers, I felt at the time that he was potentially going to start shooting
297 at us again. Uh, possibly these innocent civilians that were sitting there in
298 their cars, not knowing what was going on to get out of the way. So I had fired
299 one round, uh, through my windshield, uh, at the suspect. At which time I - I
300 noticed that he had, um, ducked down in the car after I shot the first round.
301 Um, and I wasn't sure at the time if I hit him or not. Um, I just know that he
302 knew that I was probably shooting at him. That would be my guess. Um, he
303 had swerved back towards the right and slowed way - he was - at the time I,
304 uh, shot the first round he was probably going somewhere around 30 miles an
305 hour maybe. So he had slowed way down after that. Um, as he approached the
306 cars where all these people were stopped, um, I could still see him. He was - I
307 could - could not see his hands at that time. I could see the top of his head and
308 his shoulder. And he was still kind of - it looked like he was trying to duck
309 down to hide from me. Um, still worried about these people that he was like
310 block - he'd cornered himself and all those cars. Um, I was fearing at that time
311 that he was still going to start shooting at me. Um, the people that he was right
312 next to. Um, maybe, you know, I - I - my mindset was this guy's going to try
313 to take somebody hostage. Like this is - he's got nowhere to go. He's, you
314 know, this is - he doesn't have anything else to do. Um, if he's still willing to,
315 you know, do what he'd been doing this whole time. So I had turned in my

316 driver's seat with my door was wide open. Um, I had turned in my driver's
317 seat and I had shot one more round. Um, aiming towards his - I - this area here
318 which is pretty much all I saw at that time. Because of the angle I was at. Um,
319 I couldn't - after I fired that round I couldn't see - he had kept rolling forward
320 so there was a vehicle between us that I couldn't see him anymore. So I came
321 out of my car. I came up in front of that car that was blocking, uh, my view.
322 And I could see him, um, in his car. His door was open at that time. And he - I
323 could see he was doing something. Um, I - basically I had a view of his back
324 at that time. I could see that he was doing something with his hands. I couldn't
325 see what he was doing. I couldn't see his hands. I could just see that his - he
326 was moving around, still sitting - seating - sorry, seated in the driver's seat.
327 Um, I went to position myself at a better angle so I can get eyes on to see what
328 he was doing with his hands or see what he had in his hands. Um, uh, still - I
329 was giving him commands, "Hey let me see your hands. Show me your
330 hands." Um, something to that effect. And he, um, once I repositioned myself
331 on the passenger side of that, uh, civilian's car I could see him, um, I couldn't
332 see his hands still but I could see him really good. I'd given him more
333 commands to show me his hands and he did. Um, at that point he showed me
334 both of his hands. I could see 'em very clear, um, through his open door. And
335 so I kept telling him, "Show me your hands. Keep your hands there," what - I
336 - I don't remember exactly what I was saying but something to that effect.
337 Um, so he - he looked at me. Um, looked right at me and, uh, he - he said
338 something like, "Okay, okay," or, "I get it," or something - something like
339 that. Held his hands there for very briefly. Maybe two or three seconds. And
340 then he quickly turned towards his passenger seat and both of his hands went
341 away. I couldn't see his hands anymore. And it looked like he was going into
342 the area of his, uh, pa- front passenger seat. So again right here knowing that
343 he'd already been shooting at the police, I knew he was armed, um, because
344 he was shooting at the police, um, the fact that all these civ- he was door to
345 door with a - an SUV, um, at this time, uh, with somebody in that car. So I
346 was, um, completely worried that he was going for a gun. And if he were to
347 start shooting it would be, you know, me, my partners, or that civilian there,
348 um, that he could possibly kill with that gun. As well as if he was, you know,
349 maybe take a hostage or something like that. That was what was going
350 through my mind at the time. So because he had reached into the passenger
351 seat, I feared that he was going for his gun that he had already had, that he
352 was shooting, and I shot, um, one more round, um, and hit him in the back of
353 the head. Looked - I think it was right behind his left ear. Um, and he - I saw
354 the blood come out of his head. And he slumped down, um, what I believe
355 into the passenger side. And that was it there. Um, I believe it was Officer
356 (Hernandez) that broadcast the shots fired over the radio. Somebody -
357 somebody that was right next to me. And then I held right there on the car
358 'cause I - I knew I had hit him. Um, I knew he went down. But I didn't know
359 if he was completely incapac- capac- sorry, incapacitated. I'm talking a little
360 fast here. Um, or what his status was. So I didn't want to leave right then and

361 either approach the car or not. He was obviously armed so I held there. Um,
362 also 'cause the fact I didn't know if there was anybody else in his car with
363 him. Um, I had only seen him but I didn't know. So I held there for - it wasn't
364 very long, maybe 45 seconds or so. Um, the people that were in that car that I
365 was, um, up against right there, there was two girls in the front seat and they
366 were, um, like on the floorboard trying to hide 'cause they probably heard the
367 gunshots. Um, they were crying hysterically and so we, um, I had backed up
368 to like just in front of the f- uh, front passenger side of that car. S- and then
369 they, uh, believe it was Officer (Hernandez) and somebody else, they had got
370 them out of the car to get them out of the way. Um, I believe it was at this
371 time that, um, Sergeant Elliott had came up and pulled me off. Um, pulled me
372 off of there 'cause he knew I had - I had shot. So he pulled me off and had me,
373 uh, hang out off to the side with another officer. Um, I think that's it.

374
375 Q: Okay.

376
377 A: I think. I'm sure I missed something. I - talking a little fast.

378
379 Q: Um, what kind of weapon is your rifle?

380
381 A: It's a, um, Colt Commando which is a, uh, 556 rifle.

382
383 Q: Okay. And how do you load it usually?

384
385 A: As far as?

386
387 Q: Like to capacity or?

388
389 A: The rounds? Uh, no, um, it's one of those things that across the board for all
390 of the SWAT team guys we've, um, gone to all just 28 and a 30 round
391 magazine. So we load 30 - or, 20- 28 rounds into the 30 round magazine.

392
393 Q: Okay.

394
395 A: So.

396
397 Q: And so there w- um, your rifle was loaded to 28 rounds that day?

398
399 A: Yes.

400
401 Q: And you fired three shots?

402
403 A: Yes.

404
405 Q: And were you injured?

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450

- A: No.
- Q: Um, you said when you - you saw him, um, can you describe him to me?
- A: Um, he looked like, um, a light - lighter skinned Hispanic male. Um, with a bald head. Um, that's really all I can - I can tell. I couldn't really see him sh- real clear or the details. I was more paying attention to what his hands were doing. Um, but I did notice that he was - it looked like a bald head Hispanic male.
- Q: Okay. And then you said it was a Chrysler S- um, Sebring?
- A: I believe it was a Sebring. I - I think so.
- Q: Di- what...
- A: I know it was a Chrysler.
- Q: ...where - did you know anything else about the vehicle?
- A: Uh, not prior to, no.
- Q: Okay. And did you - did you have your handgun with you?
- A: I did.
- Q: And you did not fire your handgun?
- A: No.
- Q: Is there - what's made you choose your rifle?
- A: Um, my ri- I chose my rifle because I know it - it's much better accuracy for one. Um, given the situation and the amount of people that were around, um, I just know 'cause of the training that I've had that I would be much more accurate if I needed to fire that gun, um, with my rifle. So that's why I chose that. And I didn't know that - the reason I brought it up, I didn't know how the situation was going to end. So I didn't know if I was going to be in close range with somebody or if this was going to be something that I would need, um, a rifle for a more long distance type thing. If that situation was there. So that was my reasoning on why - why the rifle.
- Q: Okay. And when you, um, that first shot, as he's kind of driving, and you're there, is there - did you have any, um, concerns about anything in the

451 background at that point?

452

453 A: No not at that point. I, um, the - behind him was because of my angle I had,
454 um, the parking lot of the Sears that was behind him. And I - at the time I
455 didn't think that there was anybody, um, between him and what was past him.
456 Um, to pote- potentially be hit. So I felt that that was - I had a clear
457 background before I shot.

458

459 Q1: Um, when you were on - online approaching the, um, was it the Camry think
460 it was?

461

462 A: Yes.

463

464 Q1: Camry? When you were dealing with the - the suspect and - and the vehicle.
465 Do you remember which officers were with you?

466

467 A: I believe, uh, (Hernandez) was to my right and I believe (Reimer) was to my
468 left. Um, I know I, um, (Watkins) was there but I don't know exactly where
469 he was. I believe he was off to my left somewhere.

470

471 Q1: Okay. And you talked about your - your training, experience. Um, do you
472 have any other collateral assignments?

473

474 A: I'm a defensive tactics instructor. Um, and collateral, um, SWAT.

475

476 Q1: Okay. So, um, how - how long have you been on the collateral SWAT team?

477

478 A: Uh, a year and a couple months. So just over a year.

479

480 Q1: And what ty- what type of training do you - do you guys, uh, conduct in - in -
481 on the SWAT team to - to deal with situations, deal with...

482

483 A: Um, we do like a lot of like hostage rescue training. Um, obviously range
484 time. Um, marksmanship. Um, guess like entry, entry training. Things of that
485 nature.

486

487 Q1: Okay.

488

489 Q3: I have a- another question. You co- you told us the third round you - you
490 discharged you could tell s- you could tell struck him. The first round and the
491 second round when you discharged it, could you tell whether or not you struck
492 the target, whether it be him or the vehicle, did you see where it landed?

493


494 A: I couldn't - on the - so the - going to the first one, I knew - I didn't know if it
495 hit him or his vehicle at the time. I just know that he reacted to that, um,

496 immediately after. Um, which is when he, um, like scooted down in his seat.
497 And that's when he swerved off a little bit. Uh, the second round I could not
498 tell, um, if I hit him or not. I just...
499
500 Q3: Or even the vehicle?
501
502 A: ...I didn't s- see it. I couldn't tell no.
503
504 Q3: Uh, and the second round when you discharged it, was your window down or
505 was your vehicle, uh, door open? 'Cause you were still in the vehicle when
506 you discharged the second round correct?
507
508 A: Yes. Um, my door, my driver's door was open.
509
510 Q3: Was open.
511
512 A: Mm-hm.
513
514 Q: And when you - I think you said it was a Toyota Camry? What - and - that
515 you were behind. What was the purpose of being behind that vehicle?
516
517 A: I wanted to get some sort of cover between me and the suspect, had he started
518 shooting at me or our partners. I just didn't want to be out in the open with
519 nothing to get behind, um, in case he did start shooting.
520
521 Q: And did you see the demeanor of the civilians that were right there in that
522 area?
523
524 A: Uh, the two girls that I saw in that car, um, the driver and the front passenger,
525 um, were the ones that I saw in there. I don't know if there was anymore. But
526 they were, um, they were on down sitting on the floorboard, um, it looked like
527 they were trying to get as low as they could and they were both hysterically
528 crying.
529
530 Q: Do you know if, um, the suspect received or was medical aide requested?
531
532 A: Uh, yes there was, uh, medical aid was on scene after the fact.
533
534 Q: Do you know who did that, who requested it or how that happened?
535
536 A: I don't know, no.
537
538 Q: That's okay. I think that's it. Unless you all have anything?
539
540 Q3: Nope.

541
542 Q: No? Okay.
