On Friday, July 20, 2018 at approximately 1946 hours, I was working as a uniformed Riverside Police Officer with my partner (Ofc. Cruz). We were in full police uniform and patrolling in a marked police vehicle, clearly identified as police officers. At this time, I heard dispatch advise over the radio that Riverside County Sheriff's Deputies were in pursuit of a felony vehicle, heading northbound on the 215 freeway at the Nuevo exit. Dispatch advised the suspect was driving a 2012 Chrysler (Ca. license 7JPW282) and was shooting at the officers. I monitored the pursuit and learned the suspect exited Van Buren and was now driving westbound towards Wood St. I began to drive in the direction that the suspect was heading and it appeared the suspect was making random turns and going in circles. Ofc Cruz and I were not in the pursuit, but merely trying to take a position to where we could secure intersections and/or engage the suspect in case he were to collide into an uninvolved vehicle and/or flee on foot from his vehicle. At one point, the suspect was heading in a northwesterly direction from the area of Indiana/Van Buren and drove northbound on Monroe St. The suspect continued to zigzag through the city streets in various directions.

Due to the suspect backtracking on several streets, I continued northbound on Monroe Street until I reached Arlington Ave. At this time, the suspect was now heading west on Arlington from Coronado Way. As I approached the intersection at California, I observed the suspect vehicle travelling westbound in the eastbound lanes before ramming into several uninvolved vehicles. I then heard approximately 2-3 gunshots and I exited my patrol vehicle and safely moved from the line of fire. I ran towards the other officers who advised the suspect was still in the vehicle and was not responding to commands. As the METRO team took control of the scene and felony traffic stop, I began to assist with clearing the pedestrians out of the parking lot before I heard Sgt. Dehdashtian advise over the radio that he wanted any collateral SWAT members to meet with him at the scene.

I was ultimately assigned to drive the armored rescue vehicle (ARV) next to the suspect vehicle so that we could get a better view into the suspect vehicle. It appeared the suspect was unconscious, however; his vehicle was still in gear to drive forward, as it tried to push past an SUV it was up against. I then drove the ARV directly in front of the suspect vehicle to prevent it from driving forward. The METRO team ultimately made their approach on foot and disabled the suspect vehicle prior to RFD responding and pronouncing the suspect deceased. I then assisted with scene security and obtained two witness statements.

I interviewed W/ [REDACTED] at the scene. W/ [REDACTED] stated he was driving his vehicle [REDACTED] eastbound on Arlington from California in the #2 lane. He stated he was behind a white Mercedes when he saw the suspect driving the gray Chrysler and crash into the SUV. W/ [REDACTED] stated he heard 2-3 gun shots and ducked down in his vehicle. W/ [REDACTED] stated he did not see who was firing the shots. W/ [REDACTED] stated moments later, police were pulling him out of his vehicle to safety.

I interviewed W/ [REDACTED] at the scene. W/ [REDACTED] stated he was driving his vehicle [REDACTED] eastbound in the #1 lane of Arlington Ave from California. W/ [REDACTED] stated he saw a lot of cop cars, but did not know what was going on. He stated all of a sudden, the vehicles in front of him pulled over to the left and right, which opened up the center of the road. He stated he then observed the suspect driving westbound in the eastbound lanes and crash his vehicle into a black SUV. W/ [REDACTED] stated he saw the suspect look back and then put his hands up. W/ [REDACTED] stated he then saw the suspect's windshield get shot out, but he did not know where the rounds were coming from. W/ [REDACTED] stated he quickly jumped out of his vehicle and ran to safety. I attempted to ask W/ [REDACTED] for more detail, however; he was short and repetitive with his responses.
