On the above date and time, Officer Park, Officer Macias and I were on patrol in a marked City of Riverside Police vehicle. Dispatch broadcast RSO deputies were in pursuit of a Chrysler who was firing at pursuing Officers. The suspect vehicle drove from the County area of Riverside to the City of Riverside. The suspect vehicle drove at high rates of speeds on City streets, not stopping for red lights or stop signs. Riverside PD Officers took over the pursuit and we monitored radio traffic. At one point, the suspect vehicle drove westbound on Arlington Avenue in eastbound lanes. Air one broadcast the suspect vehicle collided with a vehicle on Arlington east of Streeter. We responded to the termination of the pursuit and pulled into the [Redacted] man Center. We parked on the east side of Del Taco. I exited our Police vehicle and I ran towards the pursuing units that were parked behind the suspect vehicle. I ran towards a group of Officers who were standing behind a parked vehicle just behind the Chrysler. I approached the driver side of the parked vehicle and from there, I held lethal cover on the suspect and suspect vehicle. I noticed the suspect vehicle driver door was open and a male adult with a bald head was sitting in the driver seat. As additional Officers arrived, an arrest team was set up and roles and responsibilities were given out. Our arrest team moved approximately 20 feet east behind a parked Riverside Police vehicle. I continued to hold lethal cover on the suspect and suspect vehicle. PA announcements were given with no response from the suspect. Air one advised they had been overhead since the suspect vehicle had stopped and had not seen the suspect move.

The ARV (Armored Rescue Vehicle) arrived on scene and a tactical plan was developed on how to approach the vehicle. Officer Crocker replaced me as lethal cover and I entered the ARV, which was being driven by Officer Newton. The ARV drove along the passenger side of the suspect vehicle in an attempt to get a better view of the suspect. From the ARV, I could see the suspect sitting in the driver seat leaned over into the passenger seat. The suspects left hand was near the center console area and his right hand was out of my view. Less lethal munitions and a K-9 deployment were used on the suspect. See supplemental report for further.

After no movement from the suspect, the decision was made to exit the ARV and approach the suspect. I exited the ARV and walked around the trunk of the suspect vehicle to the driver side. I held lethal cover on the suspect who appeared deceased. I then put up crime scene tape and blocked off east and west of the suspect vehicle. I also shut off the vehicle's that were abandoned and still running as the suspect vehicle collided on Arlington.

I cleared the scene at approximately 2230 hours.
