On 07/20/2018, at approximately 1946 hours I was assigned to the Riverside Police Department's METRO Team (supervisor) and was on patrol in uniform driving a marked vehicle. I heard dispatch broadcast information over the primary radio channel that the Riverside County Sheriff's Department (RSO) was in pursuit of a vehicle on the 215 Freeway heading toward the City of Riverside. The pursuit exited the freeway at Van Buren Blvd. and continued west toward the Riverside city limits. The vehicle RSO was pursuing was described as a Chrysler with the driver of the vehicle shooting at the pursuing officers.

Sgt. Elliott advised over the radio that RPD was taking over the pursuit. Because of the severity of the crime I authorized Officers Park, Macias, Monreal, Soria, Wright, and Carmona to monitor the pursuit and provide assistance as needed. The pursuit concluded on Arlington Ave/Streeter Ave. While I was driving to that area I heard over the radio that an officer involved shooting occurred.

I arrived after the fact and saw officers in the middle of a high risk stop in cover positions behind the suspect vehicle. I saw the suspect vehicle was at rest in contact with other vehicles and was facing west in the eastbound lanes of Arlington east of Streeter. The driver door was open and I could only see one of the suspect's legs. I could not see any part of him through the vehicle's rear window. Air-1 who was orbiting overhead advised the suspect was lying down and not moving. The suspect's status was unknown. Officer Park was using a vehicle PA system to give loud and clear commands for the suspect to show his hands and surrender with no response. Based on my training and experience I know it's not uncommon for violent suspect's to intentionally be unresponsive to officers in order to force a confrontation. Officers Monreal and Carmona were flanked off of the passenger side of the suspect vehicle taking cover behind their vehicle. Seeing that they had a different angle on the suspect vehicle I asked Officer Monreal if he could see the suspect through the closed passenger side window and he could not.

While officers continually attempted to call out to the suspect and have him surrender, I coordinated with Sgt. D. Smith to have an officer bring the SWAT Team's Armored Rescue Vehicle (ARV) to the location since it was at a police facility about 2 miles away. Officer Hoyos brought the vehicle to our location. Once it was on scene collateral SWAT Team Officers assumed the positions on the high risk stop. The other METRO Team Officers and I put together a plan to approach the suspect vehicle using the ARV. Officer Newton drove the ARV alongside the passenger side of the Chrysler. I was able to see the suspect slumped over toward the passenger side of the vehicle.

The suspect's right hand was concealed under his body. I had officer Soria deploy a less lethal round at the suspect to illicit a response from him. Prior to him doing that, I broadcasted "deploying less lethal" over the radio. The suspect was unresponsive to the less lethal round. See Officer Soria's report for details. Officer K. Feimer then deployed his police service dog (K9) into the vehicle. See his report for details. The less lethal and K9 deployment was done for the suspect's safety as well as the officers' safety. If the suspect was in fact trying to create an opportunity to again try and shoot an officer, the less lethal means were intended to gain his compliance without further incident or severe injuries prior to us exiting the ARV and approaching him on foot.

Once those methods were ineffective we approached the suspect vehicle on foot without further delay. I called for medical aid and had fire department personnel assess the suspect as soon

as possible. RFD subsequently pronounced the suspect deceased. We eventually cleared the immediate area of the vehicle and backed out of the inner crime scene as it was turned over to investigations.
