Narrative:

On December 29th, 2016 at approximately 8:13 pm Detective Dave Smith called me. Detective Smith requested I assist him with this incident that occurred at Washington Park. I was off duty at the time and responded from home. I arrived at Washington Park at approximately 9:04 pm. When I arrived at Washington Park I checked in with Officer Jessica Avila who was maintaining a crime scene log.

When I arrived at Washington Park there was yellow tape across both entry/exit driveways. Officer Jessica Avila was standing by at the South driveway and Officer Burton Brandt was standing by at the North. The officers were posted at opposite ends of the park to prevent people from entering the scene.

When I arrived at the park, Lt. Larry Gonzalez, Lt. Mark Rossi, Sgt. Adam Levesque, Sgt. Bryan Crawford, and Detective Dave Smith were there. Detective Smith and I received a briefing from Lt. M. Rossi, the on-duty watch commander. During the briefing, I learned a security guard from Stater Bros called police due to a male acting strangely in the parking lot. A customer observed the male talking to himself while swinging "Nunchuks" around. The customer notified the security guard who in turn called police.

I learned RPD officers arrived in response to the security guard's call for service. They located the subject inside Washington Park and detained him. As they were checking the subject for warrants he became unresponsive and medical aid was summoned. The officers initiated life saving measures until medical aid arrived and took over. The subject was transported to Riverside Community Hospital by ambulance where he was pronounced deceased at approximately 7:53 pm.

During the briefing I learned the deceased subject's name. He was identified as Dominic William Smith, DOB: 04-03-1979. Dominic Smith's last known address was [REDACTED] Riverside, California 92506.

While at the scene I was given Dominic Smith's wallet. An officer retained the wallet at the scene therefore the wallet did not accompany Dominic Smith to the hospital. I later gave the wallet to Deputy Coroner Gonzalez who arrived at the scene to continue her investigation. Deputy Coroner Gonzalez issued me a property receipt for the wallet (See Attached).

During the briefing I learned the names of the involved officers. The officers were identified as Sgt. Ed Collins, Sgt. Chad Milby, K-9 Officer Kevin Feimer, K-9 Officer Shadee Hunt, and Motor Officer Vicente De La Torre. The K-9 officers were riding together that evening because Officer Hunt was new to the K-9 unit.

The involved officers were at Magnolia Station when I arrived. Their vehicles were left at the park for investigators to view. Sgt. Ed Collins' vehicle was a Ford Crown Victoria (Unit # 3131). The driver's spotlight was on when I arrived.

Sgt. Milby's vehicle was a Ford Explorer (Unit # 3403). Both spotlights were on when I arrived however Lt. Rossi informed me he turned them on to illuminate the scene.

The K9 officer's vehicle was a Ford Explorer (Unit # 3517). Both spotlights were on when I arrived.

Officer De La Torre's motor unit was a Honda. Officer De La Torre said the motor was assigned an asset number which he believed to be #A283. Officer De La Torre's motorcycle was not equipped with a spotlight.

The police vehicles I mentioned were all marked units (Black and White with City Logo). They were all equipped with emergency lighting equipment and a siren. Sgt. Milby's vehicle was the only one that lacked exterior mounted emergency lighting equipment. His vehicle's lighting equipment was mounted inside the vehicle.

Lt. Rossi led Detective Smith and I on a walk-through of the scene. Lt. Rossi provided context for two items that were on the ground. The items were in the grass in the general area Dominic Smith was when he was contacted by law enforcement. The items included a fixed blade knife and an orange colored plastic case. The orange case was open allowing me to see inside. The case contained an Ambu CPR mask.

The fixed blade knife had the word, "Buck" stamped on the blade. The handle was black and the blade appeared to be stainless steel. The blade length appeared to be approximately six inches long. A yellow plastic evidence marker (#1) was placed next to the knife. I later determined the evidence marker belonged to Sgt. Ed Collins.

According to Lt. Rossi, the knife had been inside a sheath Dominic Smith wore on his person however one of the officers removed the knife upon contacting Dominic Smith. Lt. Rossi said the Ambu CPR case was left there by one of the officers during life-saving efforts. I looked at the case and saw "Tonetti" marked on it. I later confirmed the case belonged to Officer Chris Tonetti.

Detective Smith and I searched for the nunchakus described by the witness however we did not locate them. During the search, Detective Smith located a gold metal necklace in the N/W

portion of the park in a planter area. The necklace was near the North wall separating Washington Park from Stater Bros market.

Detective Smith left the park for Magnolia Station at which point I stood by until Forensic Evidence Technician Sue Lane arrived. When Sue Lane arrived she photographed the scene. I instructed Lane to photograph some torn shrubbery Detective Smith located in the Stater Bros parking lot. The shrubbery was in an area the security guard observed Dominic Smith before police arrived. I also asked Lane to photograph a small tree that appeared knocked over inside Washington Park. The tree was located in an area Dominic Smith traversed through the park and torn shrubbery was nearby on the concrete pathway.

I watched as Lane photographed the knife, necklace, and Ambu CPR case. Lane collected the items for evidence and I took custody of the Ambu case which I returned to Officer Chris Tonetti at Magnolia Station.

Coroner Notification to Family / Locating Nunchakus:

Deputy Coroner Gonzalez made the death notification to August Smith who is Dominic Smith's father. When Deputy Coroner Gonzalez made the notification she received confirmation from August Smith that Dominic left the house with nunchakus. Upon learning that, I called Officer Burton Brandt who was still at the park. I asked him to continue searching for the nunchakus. Officer Burton Brandt called back shortly thereafter stating Officer Avila found the nunchakus lying in a planter in the Stater Bros parking lot.

Upon hearing the nunchakus were located I drove to Stater Bros and observed them. They were located in a planter that was in close proximity to torn shrubbery Detective Dave Smith observed in the Stater Bros parking lot. Forensic Evidence Technician Sue Lane photographed and collected the nunchakus. I briefly held the evidence bag the nunchakus were placed in and they had considerable weight to them.

Audio-Recorded Interview with August Smith:

On 12-30-16 at approximately 12:18 am I conducted an audio-recorded interview with August Smith who is Dominic Smith's father. The interview took place at August's home on [REDACTED] August was the only person there at the time of the interview.

The following summary is an aid to the investigator. It is not a complete factual summary of August Smith's statement. To hear August Smith's complete statement, please refer to audio-recording.

According to August Smith, his son (Dominic Smith) had a drug problem. August used the term, "Addict" to describe Dominic's problem with drugs. I asked what kind of drugs Dominic used and August didn't seem too sure although he mentioned cocaine. August said Dominic has been an addict for a long time and he went to jail for it.

August said Dominic was acting "irrational" before leaving the house earlier in the evening. (Thursday night). He was talking irrational, sweating a lot, and swinging nunchucks around the house. August used the term, "Racing" and "Non Stop" to describe how Dominic was acting before he left. August said Dominic acted that way once before however this time was different. According to August, he never saw Dominic act the way he did. August used the term, "Strung up" to describe Dominic before he left the house.

August said Dominic left the house sometime between 6:30 pm and 7:00 pm. When Dominic left the house he was wearing Levis and possibly a shirt. Dominic left the house walking. When August realized Dominic was gone he walked around the neighborhood looking for Dominic. August could not find Dominic so he got into his truck to look him. August located Dominic's hat in the street however he was unable to find Dominic so he returned home.

I asked August if he was afraid of Dominic based on his behavior and August said no. At some point in the interview I showed August a photograph of the nunchakus found at Washington Park. August confirmed they were the ones Dominic had at the house. I asked August if he ever saw the nunchakus before tonight's incident and he said no. August guessed Dominic made the nunchakus at home. August described them as two pieces of copper.

In speaking with August he said Dominic previously lived with his mother in Corona however she obtained a restraining order against him. I asked why and August surmised it was because she was afraid of Dominic.

I asked if Dominic admitted using drugs before leaving the house. August said no, however, August said he knew Dominic used them (Drugs) yesterday. August explained why he believed that. August said Dominic left the house stating he was getting something to eat. He left in the car and was gone for 4 hours. Also, on Christmas day, Dominic said he was going to his mother's house however he never did. According to August, Dominic went somewhere to get drugs.

Towards the end of the interview, August said he thought Dominic was going to die that evening. I asked August why he thought that and he said he thought that because of the nonsense Dominic talked at the house. I asked August if he had any idea how Dominic was going to die. To that question, August replied, "Just die." I asked August if he thought Dominic was going to die because he was high on drugs. I used the term "Overdose" and August answered, "Yeah."

Before leaving the house I provided my business card with my phone number on it. I explained Detective Dave Smith was the case agent but he (August) could call me if he had any questions.
