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1 **Assignment:**

2 On September 13, 2013 at approximately 2130 hrs, I was contacted by Sgt. Russell and asked
3 to respond to Sedgewick & 10th St in the city and county of Riverside, to assist with an officer
4 involved shooting investigation. I agreed to assist and arrived at the scene at approximately
5 2240 hrs.

6
7 Upon my arrival, I took part in a briefing of the incident provided by Sgt. Toussaint. Once the
8 briefing was finished, I was tasked with overseeing the charting of the weapons used and
9 carried by the officers involved in this incident.

10
11 Prior to charting the weapons, I conducted an interview with Ofc. O'Farrell who was a witness to
12 the shooting. This interview was audio recorded and downloaded to the department's audio
13 server. What follows is a synopsis of that interview.

14
15 W/Ofc. O'Farrell #1749:

16 Ofc. O'Farrell was assigned as a single man unit this night and his designator was C210. He
17 could not recall the exact number of his patrol unit for that night but felt it started with #314(?).
18 Checking the "Watch C" roster and unit assignments for this night, I found Ofc. O'Farrell was
19 assigned unit #3145. Ofc. O'Farrell was dressed in an RPD uniform at the time of this incident.

20
21 Just prior to this incident, Ofc. O'Farrell had been dispatched to a different call and he was on
22 his way to that one when he heard this call go out over the RPD radio. He monitored the call for
23 a few moments before deciding to break off from the call he had been dispatched to and drive to
24 Sedgewick & 10th to offer his assistance. Ofc. O'Farrell heard that the subject on Sedgewick &
25 10th was armed with a knife. Ofc. Childers had been enroute to the same call Ofc. O'Farrell had
26 been going to when he too decided to divert and assist with this incident. The two officers
27 followed each other to Sedgewick & 10th

28
29 Ofc. O'Farrell arrived at the scene a short time later and stopped his marked RPD unit near the
30 southwest corner of that intersection. As he exited his unit, he could see and hear RPD officers
31 were talking with a person in the front yard of a residence on the northeast corner of the
32 intersection. Ofc. O'Farrell stopped on the sidewalk, outside of the perimeter fence surrounding
33 this yard, to try and keep a bystander from entering the area where the officers were with the
34 subject.

35
36 Ofc. O'Farrell could see the subject was a Hispanic male, possibly in his 50's, and he was
37 armed with a knife. The subject was dragging the knife across his forehead and arms as he sat
38 on a bench talking with the officers. Ofc. O'Farrell could not tell if the subject was cutting
39 himself while he dragged the knife across various parts of his body. The subject switched the
40 knife from one hand to the other as he talked.

41
42 The subject was talking quietly with the officers so Ofc. O'Farrell could not hear what he was
43 saying. He could hear Sgt. Toussaint trying to calm the subject down and giving him
44 commands. The subject initially appeared 'calm' but something was not right because he would
45 not put down the knife and he appeared to be trying to cut himself.

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1 Once the bystander was gone, Ofc. O'Farrell looked back at the group of RPD officers. Sgt.
2 Toussaint turned to Ofc. O'Farrell and asked him if he had a Tazer on him. Ofc. O'Farrell had
3 one on his duty belt and told Sgt. Toussaint that he did have one. Sgt. Toussaint told him to
4 come to where they were standing (northwest of his position). Ofc. O'Farrell jumped the
5 perimeter fence and walked toward the group of officers. He ended up in the group standing
6 between Sgt. Toussaint (to his left) and Ofc. Quinn (to his right). The group of officers was
7 approximately 10-15 feet from the subject.

8
9 Ofc. O'Farrell pulled his Tazer from its holster and began transferring it from his left hand to his
10 right hand. As he did this, the male subject stood up very quickly and "lunged" toward officers
11 Larkin and Kauk. The subject still had the knife in his hand when he lunged at the officers. Ofc.
12 O'Farrell said the knife was pointing out of the top his fist and he held it at waist level. He could
13 see the subject was lunging with the knife ahead of him as he moved toward the officers. He
14 did not recall the subject saying anything as he lunged toward the officers.

15
16 The next thing Ofc. O'Farrell knew, shots rang out and the subject fell to the ground. Ofc.
17 O'Farrell did not fire his duty weapon. He also did not deploy his Tazer because he was
18 preparing it for possible use when the shooting occurred.

19
20 Once the scene stabilized, Ofc. O'Farrell checked the occupants of the house directly behind
21 the subject at the time of the shooting. He spoke with a male, female and child who all stated
22 they were ok and that they had been outside at the time of the shooting. Ofc. O'Farrell said this
23 house was the same one the subject had been sitting in front of just prior to the shooting. Ofc.
24 O'Farrell came to CIB to interviewed after the shooting.

12 Q: All right, this is Detective Wheeler with Riverside Police Department. Uh,
13 today's date is, uh, September 14th, uh, 2013 and the time is 0031 hours. Uh, I
14 am here with Officer O'Farrell regarding, uh, RPD Case P13133894, that's
15 gonna be an officer involved shooting that happened the night before the 13th
16 at 2120 hours. Uh, Officer O'Farrell, as I explained to you before we turned
17 on the tape, uh, I'll ask you some basic questions about what happened tonight
18 and you just kinda take me through what happened and what you can recall
19 and what you saw. Uh, let me start off with this. Is your ID number 1749?

20
21 A: Correct.

22
23 Q: And I spell your last name O-F-A-R-R-E-L-L?

24
25 A: That's correct.

26
27 Q: Okay.

28
29 A: With an apostrophe between the O and the F.

30
31 Q: Got it. And what's your first name?

32
33 A: Its Jared, J-A-R-E-D.

34
35 Q: Okay. Uh, what, uh, assignment were you tonight? What, uh, what beat and so
36 forth?

37
38 A: Uh, tonight I worked the, uh, up the hill, the 210 beat.

39
40 Q: Okay. And, uh, so that would've been, what, uh, Bravo or B- Baker 20 - 210,
41 or?

42
43 A: I was, uh, I held over today.

44
45 Q: Okay.

46
47 A: Uh, two swing-shift, so I was Charles 210.
48
49 Q: Charles 210. Okay. And, uh, I think we discussed who you - you're not
50 exactly sure about your unit number, but you thought it was a 31 series?
51
52 A: It was a 3140 somethin'. I can't recall the last number.
53
54 Q: Okay. And I'll check on the, uh, uh, the schedule sheet for tonight. Uh, are
55 you - you a single man or two-man car?
56
57 A: I was a single-man car.
58
59 Q: Okay. All right, uh, if you would kinda take me through, like, what you were
60 doin' right before you became involved in this thing. You know, how you
61 became aware of it and - and how you got there and all that good stuff.
62
63 A: Okay. Uh, I was actually going to a, uh, another call with my beat partner, uh,
64 Officer Childers.
65
66 Q: Okay.
67
68 A: Um, overhearin', uh, what was goin' on on the radio, um, it just sounded like
69 things, you know - they might've needed more help or, uh, more assistance
70 with the call that they were on.
71
72 Q: Okay.
73
74 A: Uh, so I, uh, asked Officer Childers hey you wanna, you know, you wanna go
75 over there and help them out, see if they need anything. He said "Okay." So,
76 we drove over there. Um, as we came up on-scene I don't know where he
77 went. I pulled up, uh, on the south - south corner of Sedgwick and Tenth and I
78 walked up. I saw the other officers standin' in the yard, um, talkin' to a man
79 sittin' on a bench in the front yard of the house. Uh, I walked up and I was
80 standin' on the outside of the fence on the sidewalk on the south side of the
81 residence and, uh, there was a gentleman that was in the street that, uh, looked
82 like he kept tryin' to get closer to - to see what was goin' on. Um, so I just
83 was kinda directing him to get back. Um, after I did so I walked back up to the
84 fence. And Sergeant Toussaint was standin' there and he - that's when he
85 turned around and asked me hey, do you have a - do you have a TASER. I
86 said "Yeah, I do." And he said okay, uh, com- or he said "Okay, come over
87 here." some - somethin' to that nature. Uh, so I - I jumped the fence right
88 there standin' next to him. Uh, as I jumped the fence I started taking my
89 TASER out of my TASER holster. And about that time I was - I had it in my -

90 I was changin' it from my left hand to my right hand, um, as I was watchin'
91 the suspect that was sittin' on the, um, the bench in front of the house.
92
93 Q: Okay.
94
95 A: And as I was lookin' at him at, like I said, in transitioning the TASER to my
96 right hand, uh, he stood, the suspect stood up. Uh, obviously I - I noticed that
97 he had a knife in his hand, uh, during this whole time.
98
99 Q: Okay.
100
101 A: Um, as other officers were giving him commands, uh, I looked at him, he - as
102 I was grabbing my TASER he stood up off the bench in what I - what I call, I
103 guess, a quick motion to the right, uh, which was towards the other officers
104 that were standin' on that side. And that's when, uh, the shots were fired.
105 Um...
106
107 Q: Okay.
108
109 A: ...at that point I just kinda stood there, um, and that was kinda the end of it.
110
111 Q: Okay. Did the, uh, suspect end up going down?
112
113 A: Yes.
114
115 Q: Okay. And what'd you guys do once he went down?
116
117 A: Uh, once he went down, uh, because of where - where the shots were fired to,
118 the house was behind it...
119
120 Q: Uh-huh.
121
122 A: ...I had took it upon myself to go around and, um, ask the people that were on
123 the side that owned that house if there was anybody else inside just - just in
124 case there was somebody inside.
125
126 Q: Okay.
127
128 A: Uh, and they stayed over there. And, like I said, I went over there and talked
129 to the - the people that owned the house.
130
131 Q: Okay. Um, the people that you talked to that were in the house kinda behind
132 where the shooting took place, uh, did you note did anybody get hit or injured
133 or anything like that?
134

135 A: No, no one - no one was injured. They said "Everybody was outside." Um, it
136 was three - three people total; it was a female, uh, an adult female, an adult
137 male and then a child, a female child.
138
139 Q: Okay.
140
141 A: And they were outside on the sidewalk and, uh, on the west side of the
142 residence.
143
144 Q: And were these people that were in the house, was that house the one that was
145 there this yard was at or was it a different house?
146
147 A: That was the house where the - in the yard.
148
149 Q: The yard?
150
151 A: Yes.
152
153 Q: And where the guy was at?
154
155 A: Yes.
156
157 Q: Okay. All right, let me go back to the beginning real quick. You guys were en
158 route to another call, you and Childers. And Childers is in a different unit,
159 right?
160
161 A: Correct.
162
163 Q: Okay, so you guys are kinda following each other to a different call?
164
165 A: Yes.
166
167 Q: And then what do you hear on the radio that's peaking your interest?
168
169 A: Um, what I heard was I - I believe it was Officer Quinn, he just said - uh, I
170 think he was talkin' to Dispatch sayin' hey can you, you know, let her know
171 to lock the doors just so he doesn't go back inside. And that's kinda when I
172 was just like all right, uh, somethin' sounds like they might need me or some
173 more officers over there, so.
174
175 Q: Do you know what kind of a call they were workin' on?
176
177 A: I - I heard it come out as, I believe, a 5150. I'm not 100% positive, but I think
178 that's what it was.
179

180 Q: Okay. Any more details than that like a - a description of a suspect,
181 description of weapons, anything at all that, uh...
182
183 A: I did hear the description, uh, of the suspect, but I - I couldn't - I - I couldn't
184 say what it was now.
185
186 Q: Okay.
187
188 A: I do not remember.
189
190 Q: How 'bout weapons? Uh...
191
192 A: A knife. I heard a knife. I heard that he...
193
194 Q: You...
195
196 A: ...had a knife.
197
198 Q: In the broadcast you remember them saying something about this person
199 having a knife?
200
201 A: Yes.
202
203 Q: Okay. So, when he starts talkin' about having someone lock the door so he
204 can't get back inside that's when you decide hey maybe we should go and give
205 them a hand before this other call?
206
207 A: Yes.
208
209 Q: Okay. And you guys drove directly there?
210
211 A: Drove directly there, yes.
212
213 Q: Do you remember where you guys were at when you decided to head over to
214 Tenth and Sedgwick?
215
216 A: I was on Central and Chicago.
217
218 Q: Okay.
219
220 A: Just with - uh, just, well that'd be just east of the intersection on Central. We
221 were goin' westbound on Central just east of, uh, Chicago.
222
223 Q: Okay. And then you guys decided to head over...
224

225 A: That's when we...

226

227 Q: ...to this?

228

229 A: Yeah, we turned - turned up Chicago.

230

231 Q: And you said, uh, when you got there you parked on the south side of the
232 location?

233

234 A: I parked on, uh, I believe it is Tenth Street on the south side of the residence. I
235 parked on - on Tenth Street...

236

237 Q: Okay.

238

239 A: ...on the south side of the street.

240

241 Q: And so that - would that be just before Sedgwick then?

242

243 A: Uh, yes.

244

245 Q: Kind of e- east of Sedgwick?

246

247 A: Yes, just east of Sedgwick, correct.

248

249 Q: Okay. Uh, and when you get out what's the first thing that you see when you
250 get out of the car?

251

252 A: Uh, the first thing I saw was, uh, I kinda - I - I didn't look at the address so I
253 kinda like was lookin' around like okay where - where are they at. I knew they
254 were outside.

255

256 Q: Uh-huh.

257

258 A: And that's when I saw them in that yard on the north, uh, northeast corner of
259 Sedgwick and Tenth.

260

261 Q: Okay.

262

263 A: Um, and I - I just saw a bunch of officers. I didn't know who they were, um,
264 until I got up there.

265

266 Q: Okay. And, um, did you see the person that they were there for, the person
267 with this knife and so forth also...

268

269 A: Yes.

270
271 Q: ...at that residence?
272
273 A: Yes, he - uh, he was lit up with flashlights.
274
275 Q: Oh, so they were usin' flashlights to see him?
276
277 A: Yes.
278
279 Q: Okay. Can you...
280
281 A: It was dark.
282
283 Q: ...can you remember what this guy looked like or can you describe him...
284
285 A: Uh, he was...
286
287 Q: ...at all?
288
289 A: ...he was a Hispanic male, uh, I would say maybe 50 years old, somewhere in
290 that - that area.
291
292 Q: Okay.
293
294 A: Um, to be honest I - I couldn't tell ya what color shirt or pants he was
295 wearing.
296
297 Q: Okay. Do you remember, uh - as I recall you said he was seated on a bench or
298 something.
299
300 A: Yes.
301
302 Q: Was he seated when you drove up?
303
304 A: Yes, he was.
305
306 Q: And could you see the knife that they had talked about in the call?
307
308 A: I could.
309
310 Q: Okay.
311
312 A: He, uh...

314 Q: Do you remember right or left hand or was he holding it or where was the
315 knife?
316

317 A: He was - uh, I remember him goin' back and forth between hands because I
318 remember he was, uh - at one point he had, when I was standin' on the
319 opposite side of the fence on the sidewalk...
320

321 Q: Yeah?
322

323 A: ...he had taken the knife and, I don't know if he cut himself, but he was acting
324 like he was or cutting himself on his wrists on both sides. So, he switched it
325 from hand to hand.
326

327 Q: So, he was actually taking the knife and dragging it against his arm? Whether
328 or not he cut himself you're not sure.
329

330 A: Yes.
331

332 Q: But, he wa...
333

334 A: Yes.
335

336 Q: Okay. Uh, was he sayin' anything that you could hear?
337

338 A: He was kinda talkin' quiet. Um, I couldn't hear from where I was at. Um,
339 once I got into the yard...
340

341 Q: Okay.
342

343 A: ...um, I - I can't say what, uh, Sergeant Toussaint was sayin' because I - I
344 don't remember. Um, but he was kinda talkin' to him tryin' to say, you know,
345 just relax, that kinda thing. Uh, and he kept - uh, the suspect kept takin' his
346 knife and kinda rubbin' it on his head and kinda, like I said, the thing with his
347 wrists. Um, but I - I didn't hear what he was sayin'. I couldn't hear.
348

349 Q: Okay. Uh, do you recall if, uh, was Sergeant Toussaint kind of the contact
350 person of the officers that were there?
351

352 A: Yes.
353

354 Q: Okay. Once - at some point you said you hopped over the fence. I guess that's
355 when they asked if you had the TASER?
356

357 A: Correct.
358

359 Q: You hopped over the fence. Am I understanding it right that you're going
360 from the sidewalk kinda going north over the fence into the yard?
361
362 A: Yes.
363
364 Q: Okay. Would that put you guys kind of an a - on an angle with each other
365 where you're like to the south and they're to the west looking at him?
366
367 A: Uh, what do you - what do you mean by that?
368
369 Q: In other words, uh, inside the yard it - it looked like it was kinda - it's right on
370 the corner of Tenth and Sedgwick, right?
371
372 A: Correct.
373
374 Q: And you hop over that perimeter fence going from south to north into the
375 yard?
376
377 A: Right.
378
379 Q: Where are the officers once you get in the yard?
380
381 A: Um...
382
383 Q: They to - to your right or to the left? Do you remember?
384
385 A: I had one between - I was standing between Officer Quinn was to my right...
386
387 Q: Okay.
388
389 A: ...on the - he was on the east side of me and Sergeant Toussaint was on the
390 west side of me on the left.
391
392 Q: Okay. Are you guys on line?
393
394 A: We're kind of, uh - I don't know how to explain it. We're kind of, uh, not like
395 a horseshoe, but we're kinda like...
396
397 Q: Maybe a - a shallow semi-circle or an arc or somethin'?
398
399 A: Right. Yeah, like an arc, yeah.
400
401 Q: Okay.
402
403 A: An arc. An arc, uh...

404
405 Q: But you guys are all kind of facing one direction...
406
407 A: Yes.
408
409 Q: ...toward the guy?
410
411 A: Yes.
412
413 Q: Okay. Um, at - at some point do things change? I know, uh, Sergeant
414 Toussaint asked, uh, go and get your TASER out. You're takin' it out to
415 transition it. Do you hear anything different from the suspect or from the
416 officers that says the situation is changing?
417
418 A: No. Um, because, like I said, I - I was watching him as I was taking my
419 TASER out. I had my eyes on him and...
420
421 Q: And what is he doing as you were standing there?
422
423 A: That's - I think that's when he was doin' the thing with his wrists. Uh...
424
425 Q: Ran the knife...
426
427 A: Yes.
428
429 Q: ...across his wrists?
430
431 A: Yes.
432
433 Q: Okay.
434
435 A: And then, uh, it wa- I mean it - like I said, now I don't know exactly a
436 timeframe, but it was like a split second is when he just st- like stood up and
437 like lunged to the right or...
438
439 Q: Can you describe...
440
441 A: ...I don't know how...
442
443 Q: ...the lunging to me? And does it look to you like he's coming at the officers
444 or is he just standing up approaching? Or, how would you describe it?
445
446 A: Well, in - in my opinion how he was sitting he was kinda just like he was
447 relaxed, but, you know, acting different, I guess. And he - as he was relaxed
448 sitting there he was calm, but obviously doin' things with the knife. But, when

449 he stood up it was a quick motion like went from being calm to immediately
450 standing up and goin' to the right, um, like a lunge. I wanna say, in my
451 opinion, like he was gonna start runnin'.

452
453 Q: Okay. So, it looked like he had gone from a seated, I - I don't necessarily
454 wanna say passive, but just kinda like you said indifferent using the knife on
455 his arms to all of a sudden quick motion up and now he's moving toward the
456 officers?

457
458 A: Correct.

459
460 Q: Do you know which officers he was moving toward?

461
462 A: I believe that was Officer Larkin and Officer Kauk on that side.

463
464 Q: Okay. And then, uh, there were shots that were fired at that point?

465
466 A: At that point there were.

467
468 Q: Okay. Did you fire your, uh, duty weapon or your backup gun at any time?

469
470 A: No, I did not.

471
472 Q: Did you get the chance to deploy the TASER at all?

473
474 A: I did not.

475
476 Q: Okay. So, this shooting happened while you're actually preparing to be ready
477 with your TASER?

478
479 A: Correct.

480
481 Q: For lack of a better term.

482
483 A: Yes.

484
485 Q: Okay. Any idea how many rounds were fired in (unintelligible)?

486
487 A: I have no idea.

488
489 Q: Okay.

490
491 A: No idea.

493 Q: And as I understand you said the suspect kinda dropped. Uh, did somebody
494 put handcuffs on him, detain him, or?
495

496 A: I - I believe Officer - there was - I - I think there was two over there and I
497 believe Officer Childers was one of them.
498

499 Q: Okay, all right. And then as far - as soon as that happened the situation kinda
500 stabilized and sounds like they called for assistance and all.
501

502 A: Right. And, uh, that's like - that's when I went over to make sure there was
503 nobody else inside the house.
504

505 Q: Okay. Okay. Um, from what you're explaining to me it sounds like this guy
506 when he lunged, does he still have that knife in his hand?
507

508 A: Yes.

545 that we didn't talk about that - that you recall or that's important to - to note?

547 A: Uh, I don't - no, I - I don't think so.


