5 **Assignment:**  
6 I was asked to attend the autopsy of S/David Ledezma scheduled for January 11, 2012 at 0900 hrs. I  
7 observed the autopsy which was performed by Dr. Fajardo, at the Riverside County Coroner Office in  
8 Perris, CA. ID Tech McKay-Davis was present for the autopsy and collected evidence items and took  
9 photos during the procedure.

11 **Observations:**  
12 The autopsy began at 0925 hrs and concluded at 1055 hrs. The procedure began with Dr. Fajardo  
13 breaking the seal on the body bag (seal #31253) and exposing the body. The body measured 68” long  
14 and 162 pounds. I noticed several tattoos on the forearms and two specific ones on the torso. On the  
15 chest was the name “Becky” and on the upper back was the name “Ledezma”. There were several  
16 pieces of medical intervention equipment attached to the body. There was also a full length incision,  
17 sewn closed, on the torso from the lower abdomen to the top of the chest. A couple of staple shaped  
18 puncture wounds were also present and most likely created by the medical staff at RCH. All of the  
19 medical items were removed and the body was washed so it could be inspected for injuries.

21 I noted several holes in the legs of the body. On the right leg, I saw a bullet hole just above the knee that  
22 traveled all the way through the body. I would later be found that this wound fractured the right femur  
23 bone. I also saw a through and through gunshot wound on the upper right thigh/ hip area. On the left  
24 leg, I noticed a bullet hole entrance wound near the knee. This wound did not have an exit hole and  
25 later, a deformed projectile and copper casing would be found still inside the leg. Dr. Fajardo said all of  
26 these wounds appeared to have traveled from the front of the body to the back.

28 I notice one bullet hole in the upper torso on the left side of the chest. On the right side of the chest  
29 below the right nipple, I saw a red bruised and deformed area where Dr. Fajardo would later find an  
30 expended bullet. Dr. Fajardo said this wound was most likely from left to right and traveled through the  
31 chest cavity. Once Dr. Fajardo opened up the body’s chest cavity, he found the bullet that traveled  
32 through the chest had struck a small portion of the liver on one edge. Dr. Fajardo remarked that the liver  
33 was quite enlarged and not healthy which would lead to the body being unable to properly clot when  
34 injured. Dr. Fajardo further remarked that this was why he found a large amount of blood in the chest  
35 cavity. No other vital organs were struck by the bullet as it traveled through the chest.

37 Dr. Fajardo looked for a possible injury from a Taser dart and felt he found the injury in the upper right  
38 portion of the chest. He could not be certain that this injury was from a dart but it appeared to be  
39 consistent with being struck by a Taser dart. There were no other remarkable injuries to the body.
