62. Narrative of Supplemental Report Assignment On 11-27-13 I was assigned to the Training Bureau located at the Magnolia Station, 10540 Magnolia Ave., in the City of Riverside. At approximately 1300 hours, I assisted Detective D. Smith by interviewing a witness to the officer involved shooting via Spanish translation. The witness (W1-Rodriguez, Mauricio) was contacted via telephone call from Detective Smith's assigned work desk (the interview was recorded, using a department issued digital recorder). S ^t atement: W1-Rodriguez W1 stated he and his wife (W2-Rodriguez, Lorena) are a cleaning crew and had been at the business at 2300 hours. W1 and W2 were in the location's parking lot when they observed S1 crossing the street on E. La Cadena Ave. heading toward a parked vehicle. W1 observed S1 visibly carrying a handgun in his hand. 1 S1 was running northbound on the east side of the street acting as if he was planning to do something bad.
2 S1 was sneaking around the parked vehicle. Initially W1 feared S1 had intended to rob him. S1 had
3 looked right at W1 while running hunched over holding the handgun along his thigh. The gun was
4 pointed down as S1 reached the east side of the vehicle. W1 looked around and observed a hole in the
5 chain link fence located directly behind him. The opening lead out onto the railroad tracks (on the east
6 side of the street). W1 told W2 that if S1 continued toward their direction, W2 was to speed away in the
7 truck while W1 ran through the chain link fence to escape. W1 was putting his equipment in the rear of
8 the truck while W2 sat in the driver's seat.

10 Seconds before S1 had reached the car, the headlights from an approaching vehicle (the patrol vehicle)
11 had reflected on the gun S1 was carrying. As soon as S1 approached the parked car, W1 observed a
12 patrol vehicle driving southbound slowly approaching the parked car that was facing north. The patrol
13 officer initially lit the car's spotlight and commenced to aim it toward W1 and W2's location. The officer
14 then noticed S1 standing by the parked vehicle and steered the spotlight toward S1. W1 heard S1 shout
15 angrily at the officer, "Don't put me the light!" Simultaneously as the officer started to exit his patrol car,
16 S1 raised the gun, pointed it at the officer and shot at him. S1 shot at the officer first approximately 2 or 3
17 times. W1 turned his eyes toward the patrol vehicle and noticed an officer standing on the west side of
18 the patrol unit. The officer returned fire toward S1 and shot him. W1 observed S1 hunch over as if he
19 had been shot in the torso or stomach. Immediately when the gun shots ended, W1 and W2 left the scene
20 fearing for their safety over being shot. The entire scene happened quickly and W1 could not remember
21 what S1 was wearing and did not notice any passengers in the parked car. W1 estimated being
22 approximately 30-40 feet away from S1 and the police officer. W1 did not believe the officer had seen
23 the gun because S1 was concealing it by his right thigh and the parked car.

25 Statement: W2

26 On 12-19-13, at approximately 1230 hours, I contacted W2-Rodriguez, Lorena via phone call. The
27 statement was also digitally recorded with a department issued recorder.

29 W2 stated the night of the shooting, she had not been looking out the window of their vehicle. W2 had
30 accompanied W1 to the location and had been sitting inside the truck in the driver's seat. W2 does not
31 remember if she had been on her cell phone or if she had been listening to the radio. W2 recalls thinking
32 W1 was taking longer than usual to put the supplies away. W2 turned to her right and observed W1
33 standing next to the rear right passenger door to the truck's cab. W1 was paralyzed just staring straight
34 ahead. W2 was confused wondering why W1 was just standing there frozen in place. W2 started telling
35 W1 to get in the truck when W1 suddenly shouted for her to hide and take cover. W1 quickly got into the
36 truck while saying, "Get down, there is going to be a shoot out!" W2 took cover under the dash board and
37 heard W1 get into the truck when W2 heard approximately 6 or less gunshots. Immediately when the
38 shots stopped, W1 ordered W2 to immediately drive out of the area. W2 looked toward the street and
39 observed a police officer taking cover behind his patrol car toward the trunk area. The officer was
40 pointing his handgun toward the street while he turned his head in the direction of W1 and W2. W2 felt
41 this was a sign indicating he was trying to tell them to get out of the area. W2 was extremely nervous and
42 caused the truck to stall three times until she was finally able to drive quickly away. W2 had not seen
43 who the officer was pointing the gun at but felt he was trying to protect them. W2 had not heard any
44 voices or talking prior, during or after the shooting.
