Narrative:

On 05-10-11, at approximately 1815 hours, Detective Rita Cobb notified me that she just monitored an Officer Involved Shooting incident on her department radio. The information was confirmed and I was asked by Sergeant D. Hudson to respond to the area of 11352 Trailway Drive, in the city and county of Riverside, to assist with the investigation.

I arrived at the scene, which was secured with yellow crime scene tape and secured by uniformed patrol officers.

After arriving at the scene, I attended a briefing of the incident provided by Sergeant D. Corbett and M. Barney. The preliminary information I was provided was that Riverside Police Department, Field Operations, officers were dispatched to 11532 Trailway Drive regarding an unknown trouble radio call. The original reporting party was said to be locked in the residence's bathroom with two additional subjects. As the officers were responding to the scene, additional reporting parties called reporting shots being fired. When Officer Fishell arrived he saw the suspect (Virgil Millon) armed with handgun and shot him. Millon was shot and fell to the ground near the driveway of 11531 Trailway Drive, Riverside. There were two additional shooting

victims, Anabella Bradford and Malvin Conley, near the front of 11540 Trailway Drive, Riverside who were both pronounced deceased at the scene.

During the briefing several media helicopters flew overhead so the decision was made to erect EZ-UP covers over the victims to shield them from media cameras. Sergeant K. Banks, Detective J. Wood, and Detective A. Tillett set up the EZ-Ups.

I was then assigned to assist with processing the crime scene along with Detective J. Simons, Officer E. Hibbard, Supervising Evidence Technician C. Fuller, Senior Evidence Technician T. Ellis, Evidence Technician S. Lane and Evidence Technician S. McKay-Davis.

Following duty assignments, I conducted a walk-thru of the scene provided by Sergeants D. Corbett and M. Barney. Also present for the walk-thru was Sergeant D. Hudson, Sergeant D. Russell, Sergeant J. Capen, Detective R. Wheeler, Detective R. Cobb, Detective J. Simons and Officer E. Hibbard.

Due to the size of the scene, processing and documenting the scene was divided between me, Detective J. Simons and Officer E. Hibbard. Evidence Technician S. McKay-Davis and I processed the front exterior of 11532 Trailway Drive and 11540 Trailway Drive. Detective J. Simons and Supervising Evidence Technician C. Fuller processed the interior of 11532 Trailway Drive. Officer E. Hibbard and Senior Evidence Technician T. Ellis processed the exterior of 11514 Trailway (where Officer Fishell fired from), west along Trailway Drive to 11539 Trailway Drive. Officer Hibbard and Evidence Technician S. Lane then processed the backyard of 11532 Trailway Drive.

Refer to their Supplemental Reports for details.

The crime scene was video recorded and photographed by the evidence technicians, prior to any measurements or evidence collection.

Trailway Drive Description:

Trailway Drive is residential street within the community known as Riverwalk in the city and county of Riverside. Trailway Drive is an asphalt roadway that travels east / west and has pedestrian sidewalks along both sides. The roadway is lined with streetlights, which were operable while we were at the scene.

The front door to the residence was open and unlocked. There were blood drops leading from inside the house towards the front porch. The front porch and walkway leading from the driveway to the door had possible blood drops. Those spots were marked as evidence items S01-S04 and later collected. There were additional areas of possible blood in the driveway and on the sidewalk at the edge of the driveway, which were marked as evidence items S05-S09, and later collected. Another area of blood (item# S10) was located in the street near the front driver's fender of the Blue Dodge Ram that was parked along the curb. These areas of blood would suggest the injured person was coming out of the front door of the residence, down the driveway, between the two parked cars and out into the street.

In the street north of the Blue Dodge Ram was an empty .9mm magazine (item# S11), four expended .9mm casings (items# S12-S15) and possible blood (item# S18). Under the truck were two additional expended .9mm casing (items# S16-S17).

In the street west of the Blue Dodge Ram we located four additional expended .9mm casings (items # S19-S22).

The sidewalk south of the Blue Dodge Ram also had areas of blood (items# S23-S24, S27) and an expended .9mm casing (item# S25), which was near the passenger side rear wheel. Item# S26 is also blood and was located under the Dodge Ram. Another .9mm magazine (item# S28), which is the same make and description as item# S11, was found on the sidewalk south of the Dodge Ram, near the front passenger side fender.

An area of possible blood (item# S29) was found on the walkway leading from the front yard along the west side of the residence.

Victim Bradford was deceased on the sidewalk south of and right next to the Dodge Ram. She was laying on her left side with her head to the south and feet northward. She was wearing blue

jeans, a white tank top, and black bra and no shoes. Bradford sustained numerous gunshot wounds and had a laceration on the top of her nose.

Victim Conley was deceased next to a tree in the front lawn of 11540 Trailway Drive. Conley was laying on his right side and facing the residence. His head was to the west and his feet to the east. Conley was wearing a white long sleeve t-shirt, which had been cut up the front, black sweat pants and white/black/gray Nike shoes. Conley was handcuffed behind his back. Conley had at least two gunshot wounds to his upper left chest, which are consistent with two wounds to his upper left back.

Coroner personnel rolled the fingerprints of both victims and then bagged their hands to preserve evidence.

** The descriptions of Bradford's and/or Conley's injuries and clothing are not meant to be all-inclusive and only what I observed at the scene while Deputy Escobar was conducting his preliminary death investigation.

Refer to Coroner Packet for details of all injuries and personal effects.

Deputy Rodriguez arrived at the scene and transported both victims.

Evidence Technician McKay-Davis prepared a sketch of this portion of the scene.
