### CURRENT SITUATION

*(Recent updates are posted at the top of Current Situation)*

The City of Riverside Fire Department responded to a report of a fire in a single family dwelling in the area of Springfield and Yucca Drive. The 1st due Engine Company reported moderate smoke showing from the roof line of the structure. Firefighters found the home locked, but could see that the windows were smoked stained. Riverside Firefighters forced entry into the front door and found a Christmas tree and couch burning in the living room of the home. Firefighters initiated a simultaneous attack on the fire while searching the structure for possible victims. There was nobody home at the time of the fire. Riverside Firefighters ventilated the home and checked for extension. The fire was caused by a Christmas tree that had its lights on at the time of the fire. There were no civilian or firefighter injuries during the fire, but the owner of the home was displaced, The City of Riverside Fire Department would like to remind all residents to keep their Christmas trees watered, and remove them from their home when they begin to show signs of drying.
