CURRENT SITUATION

Ward 6 Perry / Structure Fire / 4200 Block of Ford / RIV Incident #18-024527 On Wednesday August 22, 2018 at 12:27 p.m., The City of Riverside Fire Department dispatched a single engine company to a report of a vehicle producing smoke from the engine compartment in the 4200 block of Ford. The engine company arrived on scene to find a vehicle fire parked to the front of an attached garage of a single family single story residential structure. The fire had extended into the garage with another vehicle on fire in the garage and a trailered boat adjacent to the garage on fire. The company officer requested the balance of a first alarm structure fire assignment. The engine company immediately began an aggressive fire attack and were assisted by locals stretching a 500' supply line to a hydrant. The firefighters reported a possible working attic fire. The first arriving chief officer requested an additional engine company, an AMR ambulance and the breathing support to respond. Firefighters were able to hold the fire to the garage and vehicle of origin. The attic was assessed with no fire in the attic. A total of 22 firefighters responded and one chief officer. There were no civilian or firefighter injuries. The cause of the fire was determined to be a mechanical malfunction of a vehicle with the fire cause undetermined. The lost was estimated to be \$80,000 with a save of \$400,000. The residential house remained habitable and the residents would not be displaced.
