### CURRENT SITUATION

*(Recent updates are posted at the top of Current Situation)*

On Thursday, September 27, 2018, at 10:10 a.m., The City of Riverside Fire Department dispatched a single engine company along with AMR to 3941 Polk at the Brandon's Place Apartment complex for a single vehicle traffic collision inside the apartment complex. Firefighters arrived to discover a solo vehicle had crashed through a brick wall of the apartment complex into the backyard of a residential home coming to rest in an outside storage shed. The driver of the vehicle was a solo occupant, was treated and released on scene. Bystanders alerted firefighters to an adult male that had been struck by the vehicle in the complex. The adult male was located, treated and transported to a local area hospital in minor condition. The outside storage building had compromised structural integrity. The City of Riverside Fire Department Technical Rescue team responded to the incident and provided a shoring operation. Firefighter removed the items from the outside storage building for the residents. The Riverside Police Department arrived on scene and took over the investigation. Brandon's Place Apartment manager secured the opening in the brick wall. The residential property was turned over to the home owner. A total of 10 firefighters and one chief officer responded to the incident.
