REQUIREMENTS FOR THE USE OF CANDLES AND OPEN-FLAME DECORATIVE DEVICES IN ASSEMBLY OCCUPANCIES

Open Flame Devices - 2022 California Fire Code (CFC) Section 308 – Title 19, Section 3.25 (a) and (b)

Open Flame Devices:

- **1.** Open flame devices are prohibited in every Group A, E, I, R-2.1, R-3.1 and R-4 occupancies. Exceptions:
 - Fuel burning elements of approved appliances shall not be considered as open flame devices.
 - Upon approval of the enforcing agency, open flame devices may be used under the following conditions.
 - When necessary for ceremonial or theatrical purposes under such restrictions as may be deemed necessary to avoid danger of ignition or combustible materials or injury to occupants.
 - In approved and stable candle holders on individual tables of dining establishments.
 - Under no circumstances shall handheld open flame devices such as exposed candles be permitted for any purpose in any occupancy within the scope of these regulations.

Religious Ceremonies:

- 1. The Fire Marshal has determined that <u>participants</u> in religious ceremonies are allowed to carry handheld candles. Members of the congregation are allowed to hold but not carry lighted candles.
- 2. Handheld candles shall not be passed from one person to another while lighted.
