Our Gallery Theater will showcase films featuring Clarence Muse, one of the most prolific African-American actors. He was an actor, screenwriter, director, composer, and lawyer. Muse was inducted in the Black Filmmakers Hall of Fame in 1973 and was the first African American to "star" in a film.




