

RESOLUTION 1055 (NEW SERIES)

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Resolution of the Common Council of the City of Riverside declaring that the work of closing up and vacating a portion of Jurupa Avenue in said City has been completed and that the same is closed up and vacated.

Whereas, the Common Council of the City of Riverside did on the 1st day of February, 1927, pass its Resolution No. 1050 (New Series) ordering the work of closing up and vacating a portion of Jurupa Avenue in said City, hereinafter described, as contemplated by Resolution of Intention No. 1035 (New Series); and

Whereas, the Superintendent of Streets of said City has reported to said Common Council that the work of closing up and vacating said portion of Jurupa Avenue has been done and completed.

Now therefore be it resolved, that the Common Council of the City of Riverside hereby declares that that portion of Jurupa Avenue in said City, hereinafter described is closed up and vacated.

The portion of Jurupa Avenue referred to and affected by this Resolution is described as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of the Easterly line of Magnolia Avenue with the Northerly line of Jurupa Avenue; thence Northerly along the Easterly line of Magnolia Avenue a distance of 85.62 feet, thence Southeasterly on a curve convex to the Southwest, with a radius of 50 feet through an arc of 90° to the true point of beginning. Thence continuing on said curve to the Northerly line of Jurupa Avenue, length of said curve being 104.22 feet, as recorded in Book 370 of Deeds, page 301, records of Riverside County, thence Easterly along the Northerly line of Jurupa Avenue to the Easterly line of the Riverside Water Company's Canal; thence South-Westerly along the Easterly line of said Canal to a point, said point being 6 feet from the North line of Jurupa Avenue, measured at a right angle;

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thence Westerly parallel with the North line of Jurupa Avenue to the point of curve, said point being 112.14 feet Easterly from the Easterly line of Magnolia Avenue, produced Southerly from the Northerly line of Jurupa Avenue, thence on a curve convex to the southwest with a radius of 97 feet, through an arc of 29° 26' to the true point of beginning. Excepting all existing streets and alleys.

I, G. Albert Mills, the duly elected, qualified and acting Clerk of the City of Riverside, California, do hereby certify that the foregoing resolution was duly and regularly introduced and adopted by the Common Council of the City of Riverside, at its meeting held on the 8th day of February, 1927, by the following vote:
