Resolution of the Common Council of the City of Riverside, ordering the work of closing up and vacating a street described as a portion of Cypress Avenue, lying Westerly of the Extension of Magnolia Avenue.

Resolved, that whereas the Common Council of the City of Riverside, State of California, did on the 11th. day of January, 1921, pass its Resolution of Intention No. 502 (New Series) to order the hereinafter described work to be done, which resolution of intention was duly and legally published as required by law, as appears from the affidavit of J.R. Gabbert, now on file in the office of the Clerk of said City: and

WHEREAS, notice of said resolution, headed "Notice of Improvement" were duly and legally posted at several places and in the manner and form required by law, as appears from the affidavit of Chas E. Games, who caused the same to be posted, now file in the office of the clerk of said City; and

WHEREAS, all protests on objections presented have been disposed of in time, form and manner as required by law, and the Common Council having now acquired jurisdiction to order and proposed work, and

WHEREAS, said proposed work is for closing up a portion of a public Street and it appears to said Common Council that no assessment is necessary,

IT IS HEREBY ~~RECORDED~~<sup>RECORDED</sup>; by the Common Council of the City of Riverside, State of California, that the public<sup>int</sup> interest and convenience require, and that the said Common Council hereby orders to be done the work of closing up and vacating a street described as follows, to-wit:

All of Cypress Avenue in lots 154, 165, 166 and 176 of the lands of the Southern California Colony Association, a map of which is recorded in Book #7 of maps, page 3 records of San Bernardino County, California, lying Westerly of a line described as follows: Beginning at the ~~North~~<sup>North</sup>-easterly corner of lot 176; thence Westerly and along the line between lots 165 and 176, a distance of 25 feet; thence Southerly parallel with and 25 feet from the Easterly line of lot 176, a distance of 83.63 feet to a point of beginning; thence N. 42°20' E. along the Westerly property line of Magnolia Avenue, a distance of 1432.9 feet more or less to a point on the Northerly line of lot 154.

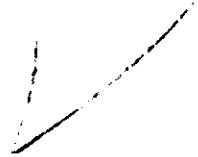
