RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RIVERSIDE, CALIFORNIA, MAKING ITS FINDINGS AND DETERMINATIONS IN THE MATTER OF ORDINANCE OF INTENTION NO. 1896; AND ORDER OF VACATION IN THE MATTER OF VACATING A PORTION OF A CERTAIN STREET COMMONLY KNOWN AS DE ANZA AVENUE.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Riverside, California, adopted an ordinance of intention, No. 1896, pursuant to the provisions of the Street Vacation Act of 1941, being Part 3, Division 9 of the Streets and Highways Code of the State of California, declaring its intention to vacate a portion of a certain street commonly known as De Anza Avenue, therein and hereinafter described; and,

WHEREAS, the matter came on regularly for hearing before said City Council at the time and place fixed for hearing by said ordinance of intention, and said City Council heard and considered all of the evidence submitted.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by said City Council that it be and is hereby found and determined by said City Council that said ordinance of intention was duly passed, adopted and published in the manner prescribed by law for the adopting and publishing of ordinances of said City, and the notice of said vacation proceedings and of the time and place of hearing was given by posting, as provided by the Street Vacation Act of 1941, and that the said portion of the public street therein described is unnecessary for present or prospective public purposes and should be vacated.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the provisions of the said Street Vacation Act of 1941 it is hereby ordered by the City Council of the City of Riverside, California, that that certain street commonly known as De Anza Avenue in the City of Riverside, County of Riverside, State of California, described as follows, to wit:

That portion of De Anza Avenue, as shown on a map of Sun Gold Terrace Unit No. 1, recorded in Map Book 24, at page 37, Records of Riverside County, California, described as follows:

Beginning at a point on the westerly line of De Anza Avenue distant forty-three feet (43') southerly from the center line of Central Avenue, said center line being also the quarter section line of Section 34, Township 2 South, Range 5 West, San Bernardino Base and Meridian; thence continuing southerly on the westerly line of said De Anza Avenue a distance of two hundred four and thirteen hundredths feet (204.13'); thence northerly along a curve concave to the east having a radius of eight hundred fifteen feet (815'), and a central angle of 7° 09', a distance of one hundred one and seventy-one hundredths feet (101.71'); thence northerly along a curve concave to the west having a radius of seven hundred eighty-five feet (785') and a central angle of 7° 09', a distance of ninety-seven and ninety-seven hundredths feet (97.97'); thence northerly parallel with the westerly line of said De Anza Avenue a distance of five feet (5'), more or less, to the prolongation easterly of the southerly line of Central Avenue; thence westerly along said easterly prolongation of the southerly line of Central Avenue a distance of twelve and four tenths feet (12.4') to the point of beginning;

be, and the same is hereby, vacated without reserving any easements or rights therein.

Beginning at a point on the westerly line of De Arza Avenue distant forty-three feet (43') southerly from the center line of Central Avenue, said center line being also the quarter section line of Section 34, Township 2 South, Range 5 West, San Bernardino Base and Meridian; thence continuing southerly on the westerly line of said De Arza Avenue a distance of two hundred four and thirteen hundredths feet (204.13'); thence northerly along a curve concave to the east having a radius of eight hundred thirteen feet (813'), and a central angle of 7° 09', a distance of one hundred one and seventy-one hundredths feet (101.71'); thence northerly along a curve concave to the west having a radius of seven hundred ninety-five feet (795') and a central angle of 7° 09', a distance of ninety-seven and seventy-seven hundredths feet (97.97'); thence northerly parallel with the westerly line of said De Arza Avenue a distance of five feet (5'), more or less, to the prolongation easterly of the easterly line of Central Avenue; thence westerly along said easterly prolongation of the easterly line of Central Avenue a distance of twelve and four tenths feet (12.4') to the point of beginning;
