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ORDINANCE NO. 4899

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RIVERSIDE, CALIFORNIA, MAKING ITS FINDINGS TO DETERMINATIONS IN THE MATTER OF RESOLUTION OF INTENTION NO. 14069; RESERVING PERMANENT EASEMENTS AND RIGHTS OF WAY FOR WATER LINE, GAS LINE, AND FOR AERIAL AND UNDERGROUND TELEPHONE, TELEGRAPH, COMMUNICATION, AND ELECTRIC ENERGY DISTRIBUTION FACILITIES AND DETERMINING THAT THE PUBLIC CON-VENIENCE AND NECESSITY REQUIRE THE RESERVATION OF SUCH EASEMENTS AND RIGHTS OF WAY; AND MAKING ITS ORDER VACATING AN ALLEY AND A PORTION OF SIXTH STREET EXTENDING SOUTHEASTERLY FROM LIME STREET TO THE RIVERSIDE FREEWAY.

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WHEREAS on June 3, 1980, the City Council of the City of Riverside adopted Resolution No. 14069 declaring its intention to order the vacation of an alley and a portion of Sixth Street extending southeasterly from Lime Street to the Riverside Freeway and fixing the time and place of hearing all persons interested in the proposed vacation, pursuant to the provisions of the Street Vacation Act of 1941, being Sections 8300 et seq. of Part 3, Division 9 of the Streets and Highways Code of the State of California; and

WHEREAS said proposed vacation was submitted to and acted upon by the Planning Commission of the City of Riverside and notice of hearing said resolution was given as provided by said Street Vacation Act of 1941; and

WHEREAS on the day fixed for the hearing the City Council heard and considered the evidence offered by persons interested and found and hereby finds from all of the evidence submitted that the alley and portion of Sixth Street ordered vacated are unnecessary for present or prospective public use;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Riverside, California, as follows:

Section 1: That the said alley in the City of Riverside, County of Riverside, State of California, described as follows:

> All that portion of an alley, 12.00 feet in width, as shown by map of Resubdivision of Block 6, Range 3, on file in Book 5, Page 127 of Maps, records of Riverside County, California, lying northwesterly of the northwesterly right of way line of the State

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Highway 91, and lying southeasterly of a line which is parallel with and distant 39.50 feet southeasterly, as measured at right angle, from the centerline of Lime Street;

RESERVING therefrom permanent easements and rights of way for aerial and underground telephone, telegraph, communication and electric energy distribution facilities;

be and the same is hereby vacated.

Section 2: That the said portion of Sixth Street in the City of Riverside, County of Riverside, State of California, described as follows:

All that portion of Sixth Street, 66.00 feet in width, as shown by map of the Town of Riverside, recorded in Book 7, Page 17 of Maps, records of San Bernardino County, California, lying northwesterly of a line which is parallel with and distant 112.00 feet northwesterly, as measured at right angle, from the northwesterly line of Mulberry Street (vacated), and lying southeasterly of a line which is parallel with and distant 44.00 feet southeasterly, as measured at right angle, from the centerline of Lime Street;

RESERVING THEREFROM permanent easements and rights of way for gas line facilities over the southwesterly 20.00 feet of the northeasterly 34.00 feet;
ALSO RESERVING therefrom permanent easements and rights of way for water line facilities and for aerial and underground telephone, telegraph and communication facilities over the southwesterly 33.00 feet;

be and the same is hereby vacated.

mine that the public convenience and necessity require the reservation of permanent easements and rights of way for electric energy distribution facilities in the alley vacated, and reserving the right to construct, maintain, operate, replace, remove, renew and enlarge lines of pipe, conduits, cables, wires, poles and other convenient structures, equipment and fixtures for the transportation or distribution of electric energy; and a permanent easement and right of way in the alley vacated to construct, place, operate, inspect, maintain, repair, replace and remove such aerial and underground telephone, telegraph and communication structures as the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company may from time to time require consisting

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CITY ATTORNEY RIVERSIDE CALIFORNIA of poles, anchors, wires, cables, conduits, manholes, markers and necessary fixtures and appurtenances; including access and the right to keep the property free from inflammable materials and wood growth that would interfere with the use of said permanent easements and rights of way.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that the City Council does hereby determine that the public convenience and necessity require the reservation of permanent easements and rights of way for water line, gas line, and electric energy distribution facilities in Sixth Street, and reserving the right to construct, maintain, operate, replace, remove, renew and enlarge lines of pipe, conduits, cables, wires, poles and other convenient structures, equipment and fixtures for the operation of gas line facilities and for the transportation or distribution of electric energy and water; and a permanent easement and right of way in Sixth Street to construct, place, operate, inspect, maintain, repair, replace, and remove such aerial and underground telephone, telegraph and communication structures as the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company may from time to time require consisting of poles, anchors, wires, cables, conduits, manholes, markers and necessary fixtures and appurtenances; including access and the right to keep the property free from inflammable materials and wood growth that would interfere with the use of said permanent easements and rights of way.

IT IS FURTHER ORDAINED that the City Clerk of said City of Riverside shall cause a certified copy of this order attested by the City Clerk under the seal of said City to be recorded in the office of the County Recorder of Riverside County, California.

IT IS FURTHER ORDAINED that the City Clerk shall certify to the adoption of this ordinance and cause it to be published once in The Press . This ordinance shall become

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effective on the 30th day after the date of its adoption.
