ASSEMBLY BILL 953

RACIAL and IDENTITY PROFILING ACT



REQUIREMENTS

- Requires the collection of certain stop data related to:
 1. Detentions
 2. Searches
 3. Complaints
- Stats reported annually to the Department of Justice.

STOP DATA

Stop Information

- Date, time, duration, location, reason, call for service or self-initiated, actions taken, contraband or property seized, result

Perception

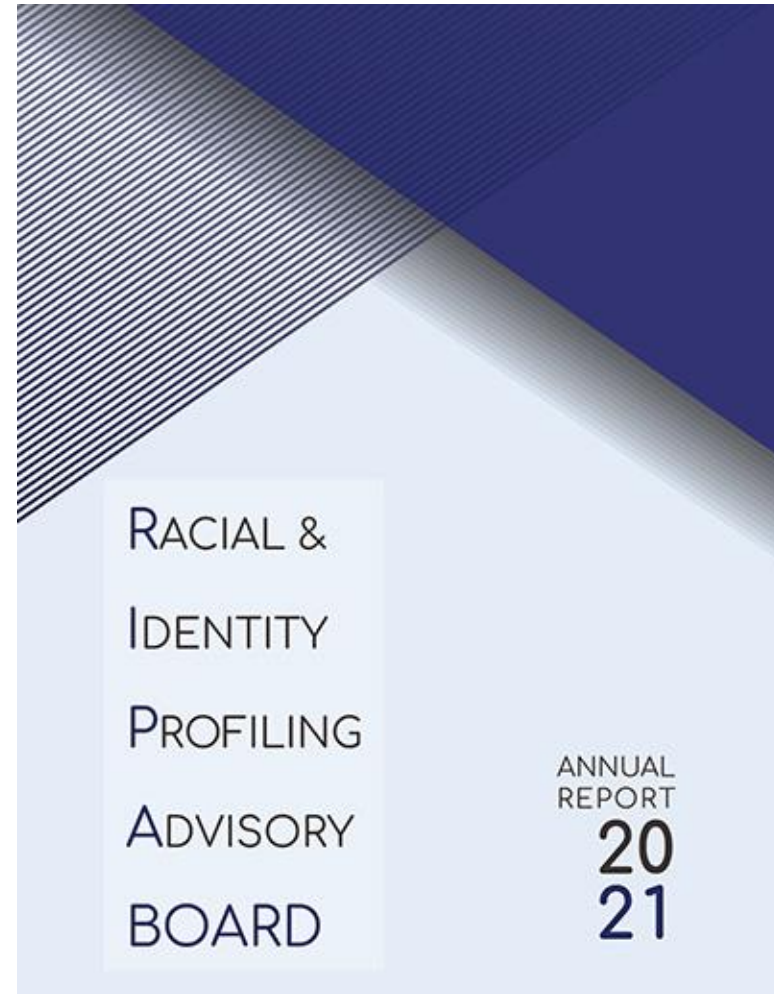
- Perceived race/ethnicity, age, gender, LGBT, English fluency, disability

Officer

- Years of experience, type of assignment

PURPOSE OF RIPA BOARD

- Analyze data related to stops/complaints of racial/identity profiling
- Work with Law Enforcement agencies to review racial/identity profiling practices and policies
- Publish annual report with stats and recommendations



REPORTING START/DEADLINES

AGENCY		START	REPORTING DATE
Wave 1 (8)	1000+ Officers	July 1, 2018	April 1, 2019
Wave 2 (7)	667 - 999 Officers	January 1, 2019	April 1, 2020
Wave 3 (10)	334 - 666 Officers	January 1, 2021	April 1, 2022
Wave 4 (400+)	1 – 333 Officers	January 1, 2022	April 1, 2023



DEFINITIONS

Detention

- Seizure of a person (verbal, physical, or actions)

Search

- Person's body/property under their control
- Pat down
- Consensual

Stop

- Any detention OR
- Any interaction resulting in a search, including calls for service

REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

- Multiple officers – only one submits report (include actions of other officers)
- Multiple agencies – Primary agency submits report
- Must be based on officer's perception
- Multiple persons involved – submit data for each
- If non-reporting agency is primary, reporting agency will submit report
- Report must be completed by the end of shift, absent exigent circumstances

SCHOOLS/STUDENTS

Student: Any person enrolled in K-12 public school, 6-18 years old (22 years old for special ed.)

Reportable if:

- Interaction results in temporary custody, cite, arrest, or permanent seizure of property as evidence of a crime
- Questioning regarding truancy or crime
- Referral to school admin because of suspected criminal activity



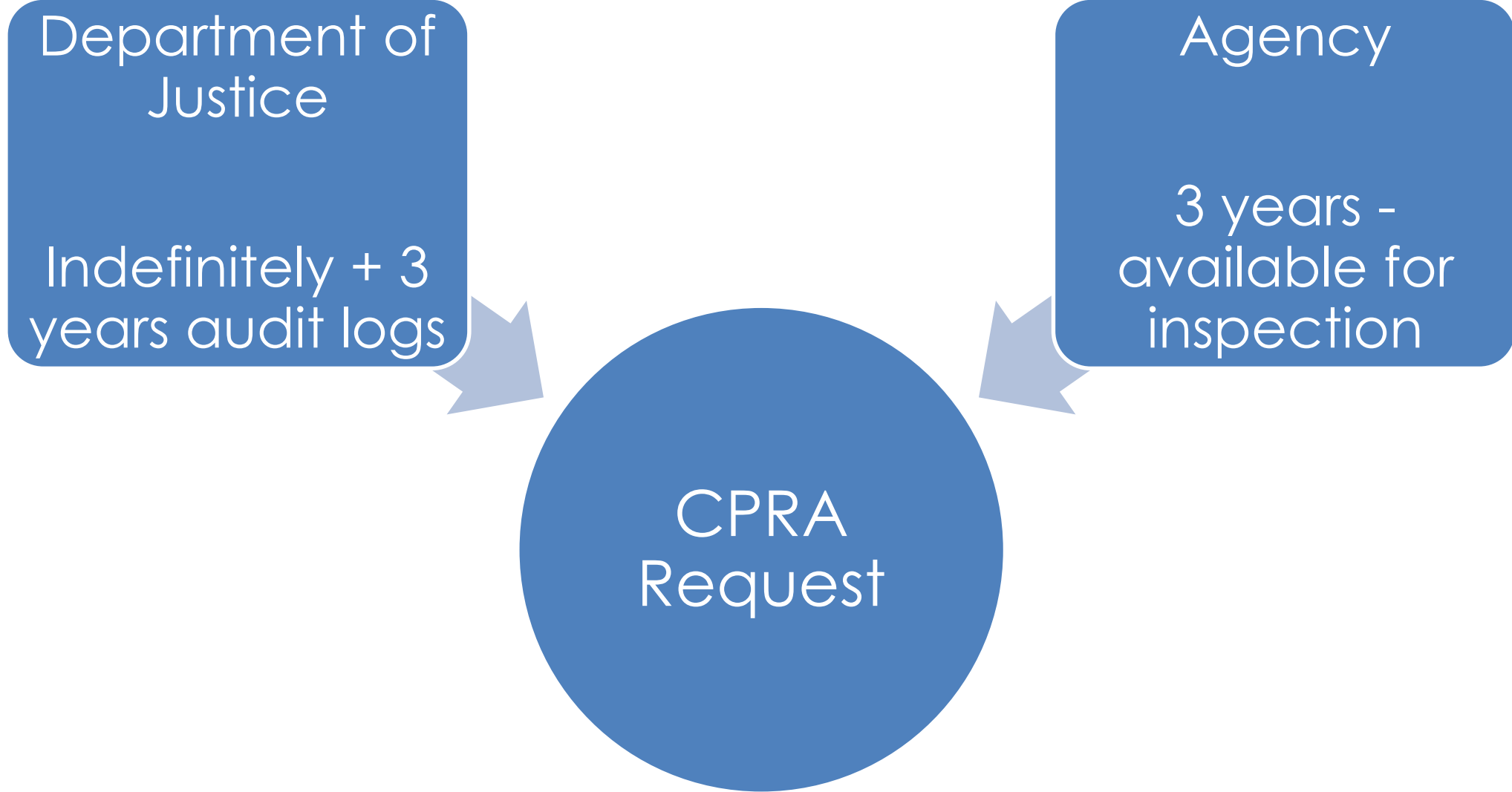
CONFIDENTIALITY

Per AB 953, officers shall not include Unique Identifying Information (UII) about themselves or stopped persons in the report.

Examples of UII:

- Name
- Date of Birth
- Address
- ID number
