CORONA 2019 PIT COUNT QUICK FACTS:

- 164 Unsheltered Homeless
- 39 Chronically Homeless
- 127.77 % Increase from 2018

- 2017 PIT = 56
- 2016 PIT = 83
- 2015 PIT = 69
- 2013 PIT = 62

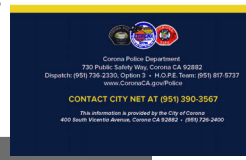

- Lack of Shelter Bed Space Countywide
- Lack of Funding
- Lack of Affordable Housing stock
- Complex Mental Health Issues – lack of resources in Corona
- Addiction – treatment centers
- Local Job Skills Training
- Need MORE wrap around services
- Encampments and camping in parks

- Commitment to being a part of the regional solution
- Expertise of 2 Dedicated Police Officers (HOPE Team) and City Net services working in Corona
- Development of a dash board to track and monitor our progress (IT Department)
- Willingness to partner and collaborate
- Alliances with neighboring cities and Orange County cities
- Help develop Regional Service Planning Areas (SPA)
- City of Corona has allocated \$1M in FY 19/20 Budget to help address and provide homeless solutions
