EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In 2013 the City of Riverside engaged in a wide-ranging survey effort to determine the perceptions of the quality of life among City residents and among those who work in the City but live elsewhere. That survey effort was designed to establish a sound baseline which would allow us in future years to measure progress toward Seizing Our Destiny's vision, stated as: "Riverside, California is a city that honors and builds on its assets to become known as a location of choice that catalyzes innovation in all forms, enjoys a high quality of life and is unified in pursuing the common good." Further, the survey was meant to spark community-wide engagement that would promote and improve the quality of life in Riverside.

The Institute of Applied Research (IAR) at California State University, San Bernardino is pleased to submit its final report on the follow-up 2015 Riverside Community Quality of Life Survey. This current survey, in combination with the results from the 2013 survey, tells a story about Riverside...its successes and its challenges.

SURVEY METHODS

Two types of survey methodologies were used in order to elicit information from Riverside City residents and non-resident workers:

1) A **telephone survey** was used in order to tap the opinions of a *statistically valid random sample* of Riverside City residents; that is, a sample drawn from the population in a way that every adult (with a telephone) living in the City had virtually the same chance to be included in the sample. The random sampling procedures used were designed to ensure that the resulting data would be unbiased and would approximate the demographic breakdown shown in the 2013 American FactFinder. In other words, the sample would reflect the profile of adults in the City of Riverside.

- A total of 523 residents were surveyed between September 10 and September 15, 2015 (with 14.1% of them conducted in Spanish), resulting in a 95 percent level of confidence and an accuracy of +/- 4.3%.
- The data were slightly skewed toward older people and non-Hispanics (people traditionally more likely to respond to a phone survey), thus in order to correct for this under-sampling and to better reflect the demographic profile of the City, a weighting factor was applied to the data.

2) An **online survey** was used to tap opinions of Riverside residents (both adults and youth) and those who work in the city. The online versions of the Riverside Community Quality of Life Survey were made active on the RiversideSurvey.com web page on October 1, 2015, and were available through October 31, 2015.

- A total of 1,483 "adult" surveys of City residents were taken online (9 of which were completed in Spanish) and 216 surveys were taken online by those who work in

Riverside and live elsewhere. Some of those surveys were incomplete, however all “usable” data were included in the results section of the report. In addition, 12 “youth” (residents younger than 18) surveys were completed (either partially or in full) online in English.

- The online survey provided an opportunity for community engagement and wide participation; however it is not random and therefore must be interpreted with caution due to possible biases in the data. If there is a discrepancy between online survey results and phone survey results, ***the phone survey results are the statistically valid results which should be relied upon.***

FINDINGS

The research objectives of the study were to elicit information from City residents and workers regarding the Seizing Our Destiny vision: “Riverside, California is a city that honors and builds on its assets to become known as a location of choice that catalyzes innovation in all forms, enjoys a high quality of life and is unified in pursuing the common good.” A questionnaire was constructed which would provide data that is useful (as opposed to simply “interesting”) and *actionable*. In this executive summary, the questions are grouped based on the four pillars of the vision (and related topics), and **focus mainly on the telephone survey results** which best reflect the profile of adults in the City.

LEGEND: **Bold** numbers are phone survey results (**statistically valid**, based on a random sample of residents); underlined numbers are online results for residents and workers. If there is a discrepancy in results between the phone and online surveys, the phone survey should take precedence.

1) **Unified City – is Riverside a unified city where people from diverse backgrounds can feel a sense of belonging and be engaged in their city?**

OVERVIEW: The vast majority of Riverside residents have a tremendous feeling of pride in their city and view the city as a good place to bring visitors. They see Riverside as a “good area/location,” a place with affordable housing, nice parks/outdoor spaces/scenery, good schools and universities, and friendly people. Residents feel a sense of belonging to their city. They are engaged in their community in the concrete – they donate to Riverside causes and volunteer in Riverside organizations. More than ever, they are using social media to find out about Riverside events and resources. Traffic, smog, crime, and homelessness are on-going concerns.

- **92.6%** strongly agreed or agreed that they are “proud to live in Riverside”
- **88.8%** (up from **83.7%** in 2013) view Riverside as a good place to bring visitors
- **88.9%** view Riverside as an attractive place

- Best things about Riverside include good area, location (**40.0%**); affordable housing (**10.1%**); nice parks, outdoor spaces, natural scenery (**10.0%**); convenience to stores, retail, and restaurants (**9.8%**); friendly people (9.1%); good schools/universities (**8.7%**); and small town atmosphere/feeling (**8.3%**)
- Things Riverside residents like least about living in Riverside include traffic (**22.8%**, up from **17.8%** in 2013); weather, fires, floods, earthquakes (**19.9%**, up from **13.1%** in 2013); crime/violence (**7.5%**)/ gang activity (**3.6%**)/ drugs (**0.8%**); and smog (**10.4%**)
- **47.3%** are satisfied with the progress in addressing homelessness in the city
- **85.2%** feel a sense of belonging to their community
- **60.9%** donate to Riverside causes or organizations, showing a strong tie to the community
- **36.3%** volunteer for Riverside causes, organizations, or schools. The average amount of time spent ranged from 1 to 120 hours per month, with a mean of 16.42 hours (up from **14.33** hours in 2013) and a median of **10** hours.

Additional highlights from the online surveys:

- 80.6% of online survey respondents said they have at least one neighbor who would help them if they needed help (and another 12.5% said they “think so” but aren’t sure).
- 42.4% of online survey respondents (down from 57.7%) say that they use the local newspaper most often to find out about events and resources in Riverside. 58.2% (up from 34.7%) find out about events through social media

2) **Location of choice – is Riverside a location of choice that attracts creative and entrepreneurial people as residents and workers?**

OVERVIEW: Most Riverside residents feel that Riverside is a good place to be active and healthy, and rate the availability of places to exercise and healthy places to eat as excellent or good. Perceptions of the quality of Riverside’s tap water have marginally improved since the 2013 survey, however a large group of residents still don’t feel the water is safe to drink, regardless of objective evaluations which show the quality meets or exceeds standards. Most feel that Riverside is a good place to enjoy arts and culture, although suggestions were made to improve the entertainment scene. Residents believe that Riverside is a place of “optimism and opportunity,” and feel better off financially than they did last year. Riverside residents feel that it is relatively safe to walk in their neighborhood, and most are not fearful that they will be the victim of a serious crime.

- **89.4%** think Riverside is a good place to be active and healthy
- **75.8%** rate the availability of places to exercise and be active in the neighborhood as excellent or good
- **71.0%** rate the availability of healthy places to eat and shop for groceries as excellent or good
- **62.4%** agree that Riverside’s tap water is safe to drink
- **89.6%** get the medical services they need in Riverside
- **85.3%** think that “Riverside is a good place to enjoy art and culture”
- **90.2%** view Riverside as a good place to raise children
- **85.5%** (up from **80.5%** in 2013) feel that “Riverside is a place where I can realize the goals I have for my future”
- **79.4%** (down slightly from **82.1%** in 2013) feel it is safe to walk in their neighborhood, with crime and gang problems cited as the top reasons for feeling only “somewhat” or “not” safe
- **67.9%** are “not at all fearful” or “not too fearful” of being the victim of a serious crime

3) **Catalyst for Innovation – how does Riverside grow its economy based on innovation, education, and entrepreneurship?**

OVERVIEW: Riverside is perceived as a good place to own or operate a business or non-profit, and that opinion has strengthened since the 2013 survey. It is also perceived as a place with good schools (K-12) and colleges/universities which prepare our youth for college or for a good job or career. Business training and support services are offered by workforce development agencies at the local, county, and state level, yet more promotion of the services is needed since many of Riverside’s workers are unaware that the services exist.

- **83.7%** (up from **75.9%** in 2013) agreed that Riverside is a good place to own or operate a business or non-profit
- **87.6%** agree that there are good schools in their neighborhood

Additional highlights from the online surveys:

- 97.5% of residents think there are good colleges/universities in the City
- 76.4% of parents think their child’s school prepares them for a good job or career

- 82.2% of parents think their child’s school helps them prepare to be a successful college student
- 64.4% of those who both live and work in Riverside indicated in the online survey that the workforce is properly trained and educated

4) **Intelligent growth – does Riverside embrace economic growth in a manner which promotes quality of life for its residents and workers?**

OVERVIEW: Objective data show that the job picture is improving in Riverside, and a majority of residents now think Riverside is a good place to find a good job and to start or grow a business. Riverside is perceived as an affordable place to live, a place where retail, restaurants, and parks and recreational spaces are all rated relatively well in terms of “meeting people’s needs.” Long-time Riverside residents acknowledge that air quality has improved. The car culture is alive and well in Riverside – most people rate a car or motorcycle as their 1st choice for traveling within the City, and a large portion of the residents and workers are unable to rate the ease of getting around by bike, bus or rail. Very few people have been willing to transition to an electric vehicle as an alternative to cars using “traditional” fuels.

- **62.1%** (up from **51.7%** in 2013) think that Riverside is a good place to find a job
- **83.6%** said retail stores in Riverside meet their needs, and **6.7%** said they “somewhat” meet needs
- **78.1%** said restaurants in Riverside meet their needs, and **8.1%** said they “somewhat” meet needs
- Smog is one of the factors people like least about living in Riverside, yet **60.3%** of long time Riverside residents believe air quality has improved since they moved here.
- **77.4%** said parks and recreational spaces in Riverside meet their needs, and **4.8%** said they “somewhat” meet needs
- **78.3%** (down from **85.1%** in 2013) feel that Riverside is a good place to find an affordable place to live
- **87.8%** prefer traveling by car or motorcycle within the City of Riverside
- **56.6%** rate the availability of bike lanes as excellent or good
- **42.8%** rated the ease of getting around by bus or rail as excellent or good, with **34.4%** saying they don’t know or don’t use those methods of “alternative” transportation. Ratings are lowest for the older age groups.

INTRODUCTION

In 2013 the City of Riverside engaged in a wide-ranging survey effort to determine the perceptions of the quality of life among City residents and among those who work in the City but live elsewhere. That survey effort was designed to establish a sound baseline which would allow us in future years to measure progress toward Seizing Our Destiny’s vision, stated as: “Riverside, California is a city that honors and builds on its assets to become known as a location of choice that catalyzes innovation in all forms, enjoys a high quality of life and is unified in pursuing the common good.” Further, the survey was meant to spark community-wide engagement that would promote and improve the quality of life in Riverside.

There are various dimensions of “quality of life,” but most researchers would agree that any attempt to measure quality of life would need to include a person’s satisfaction (or lack thereof) with the cultural, financial, physical, environmental, intellectual, emotional, and social conditions of life. More specifically, for the 2013 survey (which formed the basis of this 2015 survey), City residents and workers were asked questions based on the four pillars of the vision (and related topics):

- 1) **Unified City – is Riverside a unified city where people from diverse backgrounds can feel a sense of belonging and be engaged in their city?** Topics: pride and overall satisfaction with Riverside as a place to live and/or work; evaluation of Riverside’s social environment; level of engagement in the community and awareness of activities; and level of volunteerism and philanthropy.
- 2) **Location of Choice – is Riverside a location of choice that attracts creative and entrepreneurial people as residents and workers?** Topics: evaluation of Riverside as a place to be active and healthy; perceptions of Riverside as a place to enjoy arts and entertainment; sense of optimism and opportunity...that is, perceptions of Riverside as a “place to realize your dreams;” and perceptions of safety.
- 3) **Catalyst for Innovation – how does Riverside grow its economy based on innovation, education, and entrepreneurship?** Topics: perceptions of Riverside as a place for business discovery and entrepreneurship; and evaluation of Riverside’s education and workforce development services (K-12, college, and workforce training).
- 4) **Intelligent Growth – does Riverside embrace economic growth in a manner which promotes quality of life for its residents and workers?** Topics: economic health and perceptions of job availability; sustainability of the environment and perceptions of recreational space; availability of affordable housing; perceptions of retail stores and restaurants; and perceptions of traffic and availability of public transportation.

The Institute of Applied Research (IAR) at California State University, San Bernardino is pleased to submit its final report on the follow-up 2015 Riverside Community Quality of Life Survey. This current survey, in combination with the results from the 2013 survey, tells a story about Riverside...its successes and its challenges. Public and private sector leaders, residents and workers, youth and adults...all have a stake in the quality of life in Riverside, and all can use the information contained in this report both to celebrate the factors which have improved since the baseline 2013 survey and which make the City great, and to create a “call to action” to make progress addressing those areas that need improvement.

SURVEY METHODS

Two types of survey methodologies were used in order to elicit information from Riverside City residents and non-resident workers:

First, a **phone survey** was used in order to tap the opinions of a statistically valid random sample of Riverside City residents; that is, a sample drawn from the population in a way that every adult (with a telephone) living in the City had virtually the same chance to be included in the sample.¹ The random sampling procedures used were designed to ensure that the resulting data would be unbiased and would approximate the demographic breakdown shown in the 2013 American FactFinder. In other words, the sample would reflect the profile of adults in the City of Riverside. In addition, **online surveys** were used to tap opinions of Riverside residents (both adults and youth) and those who work in the city. Although such surveys are not random (and therefore must be interpreted with caution due to possible biases in the data), they do provide more of an opportunity for community engagement and wider participation than would be possible if only a phone survey had been conducted.

Questionnaire Construction

The original 2013 questionnaires were developed with the imperative/guideline that items were only included if they would **provide data that is useful (as opposed to simply “interesting”) and actionable**. IAR developed the questionnaires, in consultation with Gina Airey Consulting, using questions from the 2011 Riverside Community Quality of Life Survey, some questions from IAR’s Inland Empire Annual Survey, a question from a survey conducted by the Pew Internet & American Life Project,² and some new questions of interest to the Seizing Our Destiny Champions Council and Leadership Core. Those questions were structured to enable us to:

- compare perceptions of different aspects of quality of life across subgroups of the population,
- compare residents' perceptions to hard data about aspects of quality of life, and
- elicit information which could result in recommended priorities for action which would have the greatest chance of making a positive difference in the quality of life of Riverside residents and non-resident workers.

The 2013 survey development process was a collaborative and painstaking process which produced questionnaires that met the needs of Seizing Our Destiny personnel and other Riverside decision-makers. For that reason (and because there was a desire to track changes in quality of life over time), the questionnaires used in this 2015 survey were based closely on the original 2013 surveys, with new questions added to address issues relevant to the current decision-making needs of City of Riverside stakeholders. Specifically, the online questionnaires used in 2013 were augmented at the direction of Teresa Rosales, Office of the City Manager, to include questions about:

- transportation within the City (e.g. preferred methods of travelling, use of public transportation, parking issues);
- electric vehicles (e.g. use, likelihood of driving an electric vehicle – and visiting City facilities – if charging stations were available; and
- participation in City government (including use of EngageRiverside.com and City of Riverside eComment).

Finally, a short online questionnaire for Riverside youth was developed in 2013, and the same survey was used in this survey effort.

The phone questionnaire for Riverside residents is attached as Appendix I, the online questionnaires are attached as Appendices II and III, and the youth survey is attached as Appendix IV.

Telephone Survey Methods

In order to generate the initial sampling frame, IAR purchased a list of randomly selected landline phone numbers likely to belong to City of Riverside residents. The list was screened to eliminate business phones, fax machines, and non-working numbers.

Further, it is well known that more and more households are becoming “cell phone only” households. Indeed, a recent survey conducted by the Centers for Disease Control indicates that nearly half (45.4) of U.S. households are “wireless only.”³ Those households may differ significantly from those households with landlines in terms of age group (younger people are more likely to be in cell phone only households), ethnicity, and socioeconomic status (renters

and those living under the poverty line have a higher incidence of wireless only households than the national average). In order to ensure that cell phone only households were well represented in the survey, IAR purchased “enhanced wireless” phone numbers which are based on the last known address of the cell phone owner.

Finally, in order to ensure that some unlisted phone numbers were included in the sample, the original list was supplemented by using working numbers as seed numbers from which other numbers were generated by adding a constant. To the extent possible, therefore, each Riverside resident **with a telephone** (either landline or cell phone) had an equal chance of being included in the survey sample. A total of **523 residents** were surveyed (with 14.1% of them conducted in Spanish)⁴, resulting in a 95 percent level of confidence and an accuracy of +/- 4.3%. Telephone interviews were conducted by the Institute of Applied Research at California State University, San Bernardino using Computer Assisted Telephone Interviewing (CATI) equipment and software. The surveys were conducted between September 10 and September 15, 2015 (weekdays from 2 – 9 PM, Saturday from 10 AM- 6 PM, and Sunday from 1 PM to 7 PM) in order to maximize the chances of finding respondents available and willing to complete the survey.

The following table shows a partial demographic breakdown of the respondents who participated in the telephone survey. The reader will note that the data are skewed toward older people (people traditionally more likely to respond to a phone survey). Further, 42.0% of the respondents reported being of Hispanic, Latino, or Spanish origin, whereas the 2014 American Community Survey update of the 2010 Census⁵ reports 51.5% of Riverside’s population falling into that category. In order to correct for this under-sampling and to better reflect the demographic profile of the City, a weighting factor has been applied to the data. The weighted data (cited in this report) are only slightly different from the unweighted results; however the weighting better allows us to generalize to the full population of residents.

Federal policy defines “Hispanic” not as a race, but rather as an *ethnicity*. That is why the question regarding Hispanic, Latino, or Spanish origin is asked separately from the question about race. In this survey, respondents were asked to specify both their ethnicity and their race, and were allowed to select several racial categories if they wished. Following are the major racial categories on the survey. As the reader will note in the table below, 21.2% of Hispanics also identified themselves as White, 1.4% identified themselves as Black/African American, and another 5.2% identified themselves either as American Indian, Alaska Native, or Asian. Most of the non-Hispanics surveyed identified themselves as “White.”

Online Survey Methods

The online surveys for Riverside residents, for those who work in Riverside but live elsewhere, and for youth, were programmed in Qualtrics and thoroughly pre-tested. On October 1, 2015, the surveys were made active on the RiversideSurvey.com web page, with separate links for the English and Spanish versions. The survey was available through October 31, 2015. A total of **1,483 “adult” surveys of City residents were taken online** (9 of which were completed in Spanish). About half of those adults (50.5%) both live AND work in the City, and the remainder just live in the City (and either work elsewhere or are retired). Another **216 surveys** were taken online (all but one in English) by those who **work (or go to college) in Riverside but live elsewhere**. In addition, **12 “youth” surveys** (for residents younger than 18) were completed online (all in English). Unfortunately the sample size for the youth survey was too small to be analyzed with any degree of validity. Also, we must note that some online survey respondents did not complete the full survey, but all “usable” data were included in the results section of the report.

It is important to reiterate that online surveys are not random, thus results may be skewed and must be interpreted with caution. Typically online survey respondents are those who are either extremely positive or extremely negative about the issue under study and are more motivated to complete a survey than those with “mid-range” attitudes. Further, people who have a vested interest in survey results are potentially able to answer an online survey more than once,

thus introducing bias into the results. Even if protocols had been put into place to block more than one survey completion per IP address, the problem would still exist since some people have access to multiple computers. Finally, it is well known in the literature that residents who complete online surveys tend to be younger, better educated, more affluent, and more likely to be employed. And Hispanics tend to be under-represented in surveys (both online and phone surveys).

But does this invalidate the responses gleaned from the surveys? The answer is “no.” Online surveys are a wonderful method of community engagement which can provide some interesting anecdotal data and additional validation of phone survey results if the overall trends of the two methodologies match. Further, several people made comments about how pleased they are that the City was interested in eliciting the responses of City residents and workers. Here is but one example: “Thank you for having this survey opportunity for residents to engage by providing personal data. I believe this survey also raises awareness on issues and other aspects of life, which is always a good thing to have an informed public. Thank you for allowing us to voice our concerns.” Online surveys are an important survey tool, however we must reiterate that if there is a discrepancy between online survey results and phone survey results, ***the phone survey results are the statistically valid results which should be relied upon.***

Following is some demographic information describing the respondents of the online surveys. As will be the case throughout the remainder of this report, the online survey responses are underlined and the phone survey results are in **bold** print so that the reader can easily distinguish between them.

FINDINGS

Following are the findings from the surveys of Riverside City residents and workers. The results are organized by the four pillars of the vision and related topics. Within each category the phone survey results are first presented (weighted where warranted), followed by the online results. **Telephone survey percentages are bolded** in order to reinforce the fact that these statistics are the random and generalizable figures to focus on. Online results are underlined to distinguish these from the statistically valid phone results. Significant changes from the 2013 survey results are noted and discussed in the narrative.

LEGEND: **Bold** numbers are phone survey results (**statistically valid**, based on a random sample of residents); underlined numbers are online results for residents and workers. If there is a discrepancy in results between the phone and online surveys, the phone survey should take precedence.

The reader is encouraged to view the full data displays in Appendices V - VII.

1) **Unified City – is Riverside a unified city where people from diverse backgrounds can feel a sense of belonging and be engaged in their city?**

OVERVIEW: The vast majority of Riverside residents have a tremendous feeling of pride in their city and view the city as a good place to bring visitors. They see Riverside as a “good area/location,” a place with affordable housing, nice parks/outdoor spaces/scenery, good schools and universities, and friendly people. Residents feel a sense of belonging to their city. They are engaged in their community in the concrete – they donate to Riverside causes and volunteer in Riverside organizations. More than ever, they are using social media to find out about Riverside events and resources. Traffic, smog, crime, and homelessness are on-going concerns.

The Seizing Our Destiny website states that “Riverside unifies its diverse community to accelerate the common good for the City as a whole.” The site portrays the City of Riverside as a place where “*people are brought together around common interests and concerns, while the unique character of Riverside’s neighborhoods and diverse communities are celebrated and valued... Riverside is a city for everyone and by everyone... Riversiders are working together every day to not only address local issues, but to also have a positive impact on the region, nation and world...*”

A series of questions was asked to determine whether residents and workers perceive Riverside as a Unified City. The questions elicit information about people’s pride and overall satisfaction with Riverside as a place to live and/or work; level of engagement in the community and awareness of activities; level of volunteerism and philanthropy; and evaluation of Riverside’s social environment. Following are the results of those questions.

Pride and Overall Satisfaction

Overall, what do respondents think are the best things about life in Riverside, and what are Riverside’s biggest challenges? First, it must be noted that Riverside residents have a tremendous feeling of pride in their city. More than 9 out of 10 phone survey respondents (**92.6%**) strongly agreed or agreed that they are “proud to live in Riverside,” as did well over three quarters (**83.3%**) of online survey respondents. And **90.3%** of people who work in Riverside but live elsewhere say they are proud to work in Riverside.

Of course, this latter finding begs the question: why don’t they want to live here if they are proud to work here? The answer given most often (**55.4%** of respondents) is that they simply like where they are living now...in other words it’s not that they don’t like Riverside, they just don’t see a need to move since they like their current area of residence. Another **17.8%** said they can’t afford to live in Riverside, and **18.3%** said they can’t afford to move from where they are living now. The only negatives offered by these people is the perception that there is too much crime in the area (**7.0%**, down from **13.0%** in 2013), schools seem better where they live now (**8.0%**, down from **12.8%** in 2013), they prefer a less crowded area (**6.1%**), or they “just don’t like it” (**3.8%**).

Given the pride and positive feelings expressed above, it is not surprising that Riverside residents see the city as a good place to bring visitors and an attractive place which they enjoy. In fact, as noted in the table below, ratings on those questions increased significantly since the 2013 survey. It may be that the efforts of City officials to beautify the city and spread the news that Riverside is a good place to live and work have borne fruit.

An open-ended question was asked on the phone survey to find out what residents felt are the “best things” about **living** in Riverside, and up to 2 responses were allowed. Best things mentioned included:

- Good area, location (**40.0%**)
- Affordable housing (**10.1%**)
- Nice parks, outdoor spaces, natural scenery (**10.0%**)
- Convenience to stores, retail, restaurants (**9.8%**)
- Friendly people (**9.1%**)
- Family and friends live here (**8.9%**)

- Good schools/universities (8.7%)
- Small town atmosphere/feeling (8.3%)
- Good climate, weather (6.9%)
- Not crowded (6.3%)

Best things about **working** in Riverside (offered by online respondents *who also live in Riverside*) included:

- Good job/company (59.9%)
- A short commute (59.1%)
- Less traffic than Orange or LA County (30.0%)
- Availability of amenities (6.3%)

Those same factors were mentioned by online *non-resident* respondents although the percentages were different. They said that the best things about **working** in Riverside are:

- Good job/company (86.8%)
- A short commute (35.4%)
- Less traffic than Orange or LA County (18.4%)
- Availability of amenities (12.3%)

Although it is clear that many Riverside residents and workers enjoy Riverside as a place to live and work, Riverside still has its challenges. Respondents were asked: “What do you like least about living in Riverside?” Top answers (with changes over time noted where those changes were significant) included:

- Traffic (22.8% -- up from 17.8% in 2013)
- Weather, fires, floods, earthquakes (19.9% -- up from 13.1% in 2013)
- Crime/violence (7.5%), gang activity (3.6%), drugs (0.8%)
- Smog, air pollution (10.4%)
- Homelessness (8.7% -- up from 4.8% in 2013)
- Overpopulation (7.4%)
- Lack of entertainment, arts, and culture (5.7%)
- **There is NOTHING I like least (12.4%)**

In the 2013 survey, traffic was at the top of the list of things people like least about living in Riverside, and that hasn’t changed in this 2015 survey (and in fact more people mentioned it than before). Residents know that the traffic should ease considerably once the ongoing construction is finished, however in the meantime residents are feeling a great deal of angst relative to getting where they want to go. Weather, fires, floods, and earthquakes were also

mentioned in larger numbers than before...but obviously there isn't much that Riverside leaders can do about those negative factors. That is just a part of life in Southern California! On the other hand, Riverside leaders *can* do something to address other factors such as the perceived lack of entertainment, arts, and culture; and crime/violence, gang activity, and drugs. Further, mentions of homelessness as a negative factor increased from **4.8%** in 2013 to **8.7%** in this survey – an increase which is close to being statistically significant. In a related question, only **47.3%** of residents responding to the phone survey feel satisfied with the progress made so far in addressing homelessness in the city, even though there has been an overall decrease in the homeless count since 2005.⁶ From the point of view of those respondents, more can and should be done about the issue.

For the most part the online survey results were consistent with those from the phone survey, however the notable exception was mention of homelessness as what people like least about living in Riverside. Whereas **8.7%** of phone survey respondents mentioned homelessness, the figure is 23.5% of online survey responses by residents. That difference may be due to methodological differences of answering an open-ended question on the phone vs. reading a question and looking at the coding categories provided.

Social Environment, Neighborhood, and Belonging

John McKnight of the Asset-Based Community Development Institute wrote: “*Ours is an era of “pulling back.” Our Institutions – not-for-profit organizations, government, and businesses – are downsizing, retracting, and sequestering. They are beginning to abandon functions they had previously claimed to perform.*” McKnight’s thesis is that neighborhoods should take back responsibility for a greater share of these activities. He believes that well organized neighborhoods can provide health through social support networks; safety through “eyes on the street” (e.g. neighborhood watch organizations); environmental resource conservation; a resilient economy through local businesses; local production and distribution of food; socialization and raising children (e.g. “it takes a village”); and community care-giving.⁷ In support of this thesis, a study by the University of Missouri indicates that trust of neighbors was associated with self-rated health status.⁸ Clearly, neighborhoods serve an important function relative to residents’ quality of life.

Factors cited which contributed to the decrease included: increased HUD funding, the VALOR initiative, an increase in HUD-permanent housing beds for homeless individuals and families, a strengthened network of homeless service providers, and changes in weather in days leading up to the count which may have caused homeless people to vacate encampment areas where the counts were conducted. Riverside has 26 neighborhoods, although these neighborhood designations are not universally known (and only 13.7% knew of the Neighborhood Postcard Project which was ongoing at the time of the survey). Nearly a quarter – 22.4% -- of residents surveyed online couldn't/didn't answer the question of which neighborhood they live in, another 3.8% said they don't know which neighborhood they live in, and 7.3% provided a neighborhood designation which doesn't actually exist. That said, do these neighborhoods (or does the community) still provide a sense of belonging? Yes. The vast majority of phone survey respondents (**85.2%**) feel a sense of belonging to their community. Online survey results show that 76.4% feel a sense of belonging to their community, and more than four out of five online survey respondents (86.2%) strongly agree or agree that Riverside is a good place to make friends. These figures are consistent with the “small town atmosphere” and feeling some respondents also mentioned as one of the best aspects of living in Riverside.

Further, in 2010 the Pew Internet & American Life Project conducted a study that showed that nationwide, 43% know most or all of their neighbors. Based on phone survey results, the figures for Riverside are virtually the same as the nationwide figures – **47.1%**, up from **42.0% in 2013**. Online survey results are similar, with 44.0% saying they know most or all of their neighbors. Even more significant is that 80.6% of online survey respondents said they have at least one neighbor who would help them if they needed help (and another 12.5% who said they “think so” but aren't sure). It is doubtful whether the results in a large city would match those statistics.⁹

Engagement and Awareness

There are many definitions of community engagement. Most of them focus on a process of public participation and involvement that promotes relationship building for the purpose of addressing issues affecting people's well-being. Community engagement often involves people working collaboratively to address social, economic, or political issues. But it also refers to people improving the quality of their lives by involving themselves in community events, classes, festivals, community center activities, sporting events, and the arts. Riverside, as the “City of Arts & Innovation” has created a multitude of “creative” tools for community engagement including social-networking, exhibits, music and theater performances, festivals, and community gatherings. These exist in addition to the more “traditional” engagement tools such as public surveys, visioning workshops, committees, and public hearings. All of these can be considered parts of an engagement strategy to explore and strengthen community values. But are residents aware of these efforts, and are they using the engagement tools available?

A question was placed on the online survey asking “what sources of information do you rely on to find out about events and resources in Riverside?” Respondents were able to select as many sources of information as they wished from a provided list. The results of that multiple

response question are shown in the table below, both for 2013 (for comparison purposes) and 2015. The reader will note that the percentage of people relying on a local newspaper to find out about events and resources has significantly decreased, whereas digital media (e.g. Twitter, Facebook, online community calendar, or ExploreRiverside.com) has significantly increased as sources of information.

Since people could choose one, two, or all of the sources of information, a follow-up question asked: “Which source of information do you rely on MOST OFTEN to find out about events and resources in Riverside?” Those results are also in the table below, and again, social media (e.g. Twitter, Facebook) is the predominantly used source of information.

Online survey respondents were also explicitly asked: Do you ever use the online community calendar on RiversideCA.gov or ExploreRiverside.com? Over a quarter of respondents (28.3% -- up from 21.9% in 2013) said “yes” and another 24.8% said “sometimes.” These results, in concert with those in the table above, would indicate that Riverside residents are increasingly becoming aware of the digital methods of transmitting information about events and resources being used by Riverside leaders.

Finally, this year a new question was asked regarding participation in Riverside City government, and 41.6% of residents who completed the survey online indicated that they had participated at some time. 78.8% of those individuals said they are most likely to participate in City government when something affects their neighborhood, and it appears that more people would get involved if there were more opportunities to offer opinions via technology rather than “in person.”

Volunteerism and Philanthropy

Why do people give? Studies show that there are three broad categories of reasons why people donate their time and/or money: (1) “Purely altruistic” (donating because of the social good which results from their actions); (2) “Impurely altruistic” (engaging in charitable giving because of the benefits that they derive from their acts, including internal satisfaction and enjoyment from knowing they have contributed); and (3) “Not at all altruistic” (those who donate because of the public recognition and, at times, the tax deduction they get from the donation). Studies also show that people in the lowest and highest income groups tend to give larger proportions of their incomes to charities than those in the middle income groups, and charitable giving tends to increase with age and income. Finally, studies show that “giving” increases when there is a small group of identifiable victims (as opposed to a large “abstract” group) and when the victims are local rather than far away.

Riverside residents were asked in the phone survey if they donate to Riverside causes or organizations. Most phone survey respondents (**60.9%**) indicated that they donate to Riverside causes and another **1.9%** said they donate to causes, but not in Riverside. Over half (**52.7%**) of respondents who give indicated that give to both religious institutions and other nonprofit organizations, and a third (**34.3%**) give only to non-profits, with the remaining **13.0%** giving solely to religious institutions.

The data also show that older respondents had a higher rate of giving than younger. Specifically, **42.3%** of individuals below 35 years of age reported donating to Riverside causes, whereas approximately **2/3** of middle age respondents (35 to 59 years old) and seniors (60+) reported donating. And as would be expected, income was also a factor: **45.3%** of those with incomes below \$25,000 donate, as do **59.7%** of middle income (\$25,000 - < \$65,000) and **71.3%** of those with incomes of \$65,000 or more.

Volunteerism is another indicator of the extent of people’s ties to their community, and a great many opportunities for volunteerism exist in Riverside, e.g. placing flags on graves at Veteran’s and Memorial Day, cleaning up graffiti in parks, helping at the Salvation Army, helping with the survey of homeless persons living in Riverside, working at senior centers, and many other options listed on sites such as www.justserve.org. Over a third of phone survey respondents (**36.3%**) said they volunteer for Riverside causes, organizations, or schools. The

reported number of volunteer hours per month ranged from **1 to 120** hours, with a mean of **16.42** hours (up from **14.33** hours in 2013) and a median of **10** hours (unchanged from 2013).

The online survey of Riverside residents showed relatively similar results to those above, with 61.1% reporting that they donate to Riverside causes or organizations (and another 15.5% saying they donate, but not in Riverside). Nearly half of those respondents (48.3%) indicated that 25% or less of their total charitable giving goes to Riverside causes. An amazing 53.6% said they volunteer for Riverside causes, organizations, or schools (a figure significantly higher than reported by the phone survey respondents).

2) **Location of choice – is Riverside a location of choice that attracts creative and entrepreneurial people as residents and workers?**

OVERVIEW: Most Riverside residents feel that Riverside is a good place to be active and healthy, and rate the availability of places to exercise and healthy places to eat as excellent or good. Perceptions of the quality of Riverside’s tap water have marginally improved since the 2013 survey, however a large group of residents still don’t feel the water is safe to drink, regardless of objective evaluations which show the quality meets or exceeds standards. Most feel that Riverside is a good place to enjoy arts and culture, although suggestions were made to improve the entertainment scene. Residents believe that Riverside is a place of “optimism and opportunity,” and feel better off financially than they did last year. Riverside residents feel that it is relatively safe to walk in their neighborhood, and most are not fearful that they will be the victim of a serious crime.

Every year the web site www.livability.com lists the “top 100 best places to live.” What factors enable a small to mid-size city to be placed on the list? The “LivScore” assigned to each city is a composite of “the basics” (e.g. varied and affordable housing, low crime rates, a strong economy and accessible quality health care); amenities (e.g. natural and outdoor amenities, cultural attractions, etc....basically how “fun and pleasant” the city is); the economics of the area (e.g. jobs, unemployment, affordability); availability of good education (both the K-12 system and accredited colleges/universities); social and civic capital (the level of engagement of residents); and transportation and infrastructure (e.g. commuting, availability and usage of public transportation).

This section of the report deals with how well the City of Riverside measures up on several of these variables which can make a city “livable”...that is, a “location of choice.”

Health and Public Health – Riverside as a place to be active and healthy

The World Health Organization defines a “healthy city” as a process, not an outcome. It is a commitment to health and a “process and structure for achieving it.” A healthy city is an “active city”, one that “continually creates and improves its physical and social environments and expands the community resources that enable people to mutually support each other in performing all the functions of life and developing to their maximum potential.”¹⁰ Many factors contribute to making a healthy city, but it all starts with leaders who have a commitment to: create policies which help to create/maintain a clean environment, encourage the establishment of places to exercise and buy healthy food, and do everything in their power to ensure the availability of good medical care.

As in the 2013 study, Riverside residents rate Riverside highly as a “healthy city.” For example, the vast majority of respondents either strongly agreed or agreed that Riverside is a “good place to be active and healthy” (**89.4%** of phone survey respondents and 84.6% of online survey respondents). About three quarters of phone survey respondents (**75.8%**) said the availability of places to exercise and be active in the neighborhood is excellent or good, and a similar amount (**71.0%**) said the same about the availability of healthy places to eat and shop for groceries. Those figures were somewhat lower for online survey respondents, with 66.8% rating the availability of places to exercise and be active as excellent or good, and 56.7% giving those ratings to availability of healthy places to eat.

There were no significant differences in answers based on income (as some might have expected), however the data do show some differences based on zip code. Specifically, phone survey respondents from 92503 and 92506 gave the significantly higher ratings on availability of healthy places to eat and shop for groceries than those from 92501. And the lowest ratings relative to the availability of places to exercise and be active came from those in the 92504 and 92507 zip codes, whereas the highest ratings came from 92501, 92505, and 92508.

One specific factor which has historically been an issue in the county as a whole as well as the City of Riverside in particular has been the rating of tap water. In 2009, Riverside’s tap water was rated the second worst in the nation according to a report by The Environment Working Group, a non-profit public health advocacy organization. Reports from Riverside Public Utilities indicate that they have worked hard to ensure that the city’s water is safe, reliable, and high quality, and that it “meets or surpasses all state and federal standards for water quality.”¹¹ Yet the issue persists, since in January 2015, a report profiled by NBC news listed Riverside County as number 7 on the list of the ten worst water cities in the US, and the City of Riverside came in #9, with 15 chemicals that exceed health guidelines.¹²

The majority of Riverside residents don't appear to be overwhelmingly concerned. When phone survey respondents were asked whether they felt that Riverside's tap water is safe to drink, more than 6 out of 10 (**62.4%**) strongly agreed or agreed. This figure is marginally higher than the **59.9%** of 2013 survey respondents who felt that way. Over a quarter of respondents (**28.0%**) disagreed and **9.6%** *strongly* disagreed. Online survey respondents who live in Riverside gave similar ratings, with 63.4% feeling the water is safe to drink. Clearly there appears to be a "disconnect" between perceptions of a sizable group of residents and the data cited in Riverside Public Utilities reports.

On another health-related topic: The vast majority of phone survey respondents (**89.6%**) and online survey respondents (84.2%) strongly agree or agree that they get the medical services they need in Riverside. Higher income individuals in the phone survey report slightly more agreement with that statement than lower income individuals (although the difference was not statistically significant), and older respondents (60+ years old) were significantly more likely to agree that they get needed medical services than individuals in the lower age groups. The big news, however, is that overall, regardless of variables such as income, zip code, or age group; most people are able to access needed medical services.

While it is encouraging that 9 out of 10 respondents are able to find the medical services they need, however it is still important to determine the reasons the other 10% *aren't* getting the needed care. Out of the **47** phone survey respondents who indicated they were unable to get care, **9** said they can't afford it or don't have medical insurance (even though the Affordable Care Act is now in place). Access to *specific* types of care also appears to be a problem for **19** people who said they have to go outside of Riverside to get the services they need. The larger online survey allowed the 191 respondents who couldn't get care the opportunity to list several reasons why that was the case, and 51 said they can't afford or don't have medical insurance. Nearly a third (57 people) said they have to go outside of Riverside to get the services they need, 48 said that there aren't enough good doctors in the City, another 46 said they have to wait too long for an appointment, and 41 said they "can't find a doctor who understands their concerns or condition.

So bottom line: most Riversiders are pleased with access to medical facilities; however the numbers still lend credence to the need for more high-quality doctors in the area.

Arts, Culture, and Entertainment

Riverside is known as the City of Arts and Innovation, a city which boasts about its historic background, architecture, museums, festivals, art galleries, parks, theaters, restaurants, and more. The good news is that the vast majority of phone respondents (**85.3%**) and most online survey respondents (75.3% -- up from 66.6% in 2013) either strongly agreed or agreed that "Riverside is a good place to enjoy art and culture." There were no significant differences in responses based on income or age. One often hears in casual conversation (especially among

young people) the phrase “there’s nothing to do in Riverside,” yet these survey results indicate that this persistent thought is not shared by the statistically valid random sample of respondents.

Getting more specific, the following table shows the results of the questions placed on the survey to elicit residents’ and workers’ views of various aspects of arts, culture, and entertainment in Riverside:

Responses from phone survey respondents remained relatively stable since 2013, however residents who responded to the survey online were much more likely in 2015 than in 2013 to say that their needs were met relative to places to hear music and dance, places to see concerts and live theater, and festivals and special events. Online respondents who work in Riverside but live elsewhere also showed dramatic increases in percentages saying their needs were met. From one point of view the numbers in the table above are positive in that the needs of most people appear to be met. However the right hand column indicates that much more needs to be done to advertise Riverside’s cultural opportunities. Although there is a great deal of publicity in local newspapers and City web sites advertising these entertainment options (as well as festivals and special events), the news is apparently still not getting out to all respondents.

It is not enough to simply ask if people’s cultural and entertainment needs are being met. Those data are interesting; however they aren’t especially “actionable.” Follow up questions were provided to those respondents who indicated that their needs were not met (or were only “somewhat” met), asking them to specify what they would like in each of the categories. A full array of comments has been provided to Seizing Our Destiny staff, however it is worth noting in this report that many of the responses indicated a desire for more variety, more family friendly shows and events, more affordable options, and better security and safety. And several respondents in both the phone survey and the online survey said “Bring back the Orange Blossom Festival...but with changes.”

Optimism and Opportunity

Countless studies have shown that people with an optimistic outlook have healthier relationships, enjoy better mental and physical health, and have a better overall quality of life than those who are not optimistic. Thus this quality-of-life study included questions evaluating people's level of optimism and the extent to which they see future opportunity to thrive. Specifically, the survey elicited people's views on questions such as: Is Riverside seen as a good place to raise children? Is it a good place to realize one's goals and dreams? Is it a good place for students in college, and retirees? Is it a good place to thrive financially? The survey results indicate that the answer to these questions is "yes."

The vast majority of respondents (**90.2%** in the phone survey and 84.1% in the online survey) either "strongly agree" or "agree" that Riverside is a good place to raise children. Further, **85.5%** (up from **80.5%** in 2013) of phone survey respondents feel that "Riverside is a place where I can realize the goals I have for my future." That figure is 71.8% in the online survey. These figures definitely exemplify optimism and opportunity, factors which make a city a "location of choice."

The survey also included questions about respondents' perceptions of their past and future financial stability. When phone survey respondents were asked "In comparison to a year ago, would you say that you and your family are financially better off, about the same, or worse off", most respondents (**55.6%**) said they were the same as last year, while an encouraging **30.2%** (up from **23.7%** in 2013) said they are now better off than before. Only **14.2%** (down from **19.4%** in 2013) indicated that they are worse off. The results from the online survey of residents were comparable, with 34.2% feeling they would be better off next year and 15.5% indicating that things have gotten worse. To place these figures in context, IAR's 2015 Inland Empire Annual Survey of San Bernardino County residents revealed that only 24.1% were financially better off than the year before. A citywide analysis of that annual survey shows that the residents of the City of Riverside appear to be more upbeat about their current financial health than those in major San Bernardino County cities such as Ontario, Rancho Cucamonga, and Redlands.

The above question looked at a comparison of this year's financial situation with last year's. But how about the future? Riverside respondents were asked: "Now looking ahead, do you think that a year from now you and your family will be better off, the same, or worse off than you are now?" After asking that question on the Inland Empire Annual Survey for the past 18 years, we still find it amazing that regardless of people's evaluations of their current financial condition, they still continue to be encouraged about their future financial prospects. Nearly half of phone survey respondents (**49.3%**) and 42.8% of online respondents expect to be better off financially by next year. Again, for comparison purposes, only Inland Empire Annual Survey respondents from the cities of Ontario, Rialto, and (interestingly) bankrupt San Bernardino were more optimistic than Riversiders about their financial futures.

The online survey also included specific questions answered only by college students and older residents to determine their feelings about the future. First, the 96 college students who responded to the online survey were asked “Do you think Riverside is a good place to live for college students?” The majority (71.9%) answered in the affirmative. Those who said “no” were asked to offer suggestions about what would make Riverside a better place to live for college students like themselves. Affordability of living was mentioned most often: “Better affordable housing, and more valuable internships,” “More affordable tuition options and housing,” “I have to choose between a paycheck and taking classes.” In addition, crime and safety are big issues for students: “Really dangerous and feels unsafe...people get mugged before it is even dark...it’s scary to live here,” “University Ave. is a mess...there are so many homeless people and crack addicts and creepy men who stare at us university girls,” “We need more police presence.” Of course, as one might anticipate, comments were also made regarding the need for better night life and entertainment, and more job opportunities and internships. But the time line, as has been quoted relative to UCR’s medical school, is: “Train here, stay here.” College students will only stay/settle in Riverside if they have had a good experience in Riverside while going to school and if they see opportunity within the City.

On the other end of the age spectrum, online respondents who indicated that they are 65 years old or older were asked if Riverside is a “good place to live” for people in their age group. More than three-quarters (79.5%, down from 84.7% in 2013) agreed or strongly agreed that Riverside as a “good place to live for those 65 or older.” The following comments reflect the suggestions which were offered for making Riverside a better place to live for those over 65: “More police drive-bys on my street to feel safe in my home, day and night,” “Services for seniors is not the priority for Riverside,” “Better sidewalks, better road maintenance,” “more activities and social events for seniors...our senior centers are lacking in exercise equipment and programs,” “More senior housing,” and “More affordable housing and public transportation.”

Perceptions of Safety

Safety is an important condition for the economic and social development of an area and the *perception* of safety is important as well. If an area is perceived as unsafe, residents and visitors begin to abandon the area, and businesses often follow the exodus.

Riverside residents were asked: “Do you feel it is safe to walk in your neighborhood,” and people who work in Riverside but live elsewhere were asked to evaluate the safety (or lack thereof) of the area near their workplace. In general, people believe that they are relatively safe, and the statistics haven’t changed much since the 2013 survey. Following are the results from the various survey methods:

Those who answered that they don't feel safe (or feel only "somewhat safe") were asked the follow-up question: "What makes you feel it is unsafe?" Most of the answers from the phone survey (**61.8%**) revolved around crime (including gang issues), with another **12.4%** listing "the homeless" and **6.3%** mentioning "poor lighting" in the area. The percentages mentioning these factors were different in the online survey, however crime, the homeless, and lighting issues were still listed, in addition to no/bad sidewalks, dangerous intersections, and too much traffic.

Reasons given for feeling unsafe walking near the *work location* are basically the same as those given relative to walking in residents' *neighborhoods*, predominantly crime, traffic, and no/bad sidewalks.

There is clearly a discrepancy in responses on this question based on the survey modality, a discrepancy most likely due to the fact that *hearing* a question is different than *reading* a question. Phone survey respondents hearing the question probably thought it was a "yes/no" question and didn't perceive initially that an answer of "somewhat" was acceptable. Online survey respondents obviously saw that "somewhat" was a possible option. Thus the reader is encouraged to focus on the fact that the combination of "yes" and "somewhat" responses are relatively consistent (and within the margin of error) for all but the online survey of those who work in Riverside but live elsewhere.

Focusing on the phone survey respondents (since that represents the most representative sample of all techniques), there are clearly some differences in perceptions of safety based on zip code, and there are significant differences between the 2013 and 2015 data. Specifically, the 92505 and 92504 zip codes showed a significant decrease in percent feeling safe walking in the neighborhood, while 92508 showed a significant increase.

There wasn't a sufficient sample size in all neighborhoods to conduct a full analysis by neighborhood (especially since 30% of respondents weren't able to indicate what neighborhood they live in, and many who DID give a neighborhood designation had to be prompted or mentioned a neighborhood which doesn't actually exist). On the other hand, it will be no surprise that people in Canyon Crest had the highest percentage of people feeling safe (**97.3%**), whereas the lowest ratings of safety are given by residents in Eastside Arlanza, Arlington, and Downtown. There was no statistically significant relationship between age and feelings of safety, however there was a relationship between income and feelings of safety, with people in the income category of \$65,000 or higher having more of a feeling of safety than those making less than \$25,000 (**87.6%** feeling safe vs. **68.4%**).

Respondents were also asked: "How fearful are you that you will be the victim of a serious crime, such as a violent or costly crime, in Riverside?" The options for answers were "not at all fearful," "not too fearful," "somewhat fearful," or "very fearful."

The above table shows that the majority of Riverside residents and workers are not overwhelmingly fearful that they will be the victim of a serious crime. It also shows that the fear of crime has marginally decreased between 2013 and 2015. Further, rates of fear are significantly lower in the City of Riverside than in cities surveyed in the recent Inland Empire Annual Survey conducted throughout San Bernardino County. In the San Bernardino County

survey, 61.3% of San Bernardino City residents and 38.6% of county-wide respondents reported being somewhat or very fearful, as opposed to the **32.1%** in this comparable Riverside City phone survey. There have been improvements over time, and hopefully those improvements will continue.

It is important to determine whether Riverside residents' and workers' fear of crime truly reflects the level of crime in the city. But without a detailed probing of responses there is no way of determining the reasons behind people's perceptions. It is possible that the fear of crime may not be based on objective reality, but rather on past experiences, or media hype, or generic fear that crime would increase after AB109 (prison realignment) took effect in October 2011 (which has apparently not occurred according to an August 2015 research report from the Center on Juvenile and Criminal Justice¹³ which indicates that crime actually *declined* statewide in most counties after realignment took effect). Regardless, it is worth noting that "feeling safe overall in the City" received an average importance score of 91.26 out of 100 (where 0 = not important and 100 = very important).

3) **Catalyst for Innovation – how does Riverside grow its economy based on innovation, education, and entrepreneurship?**

OVERVIEW: Riverside is perceived as a good place to own or operate a business or non-profit, and that opinion has strengthened since the 2013 survey. It is also perceived as a place with good schools (K-12) and colleges/universities which prepare our youth for college or for a good job or career. Business training and support services are offered by workforce development agencies at the local, county, and state level, yet more promotion of the services is needed since many of Riverside's workers are unaware that the services exist.

Over the past several years, Riverside leaders have put forth a great deal of effort into collaborations with the community to encourage business start-ups, new jobs, and new technologies. Examples abound in the Riverside media, e.g. an EPA grant given to UCR students for the development of a reusable storm drain filter; The Inland Empire Small Business Development Center which provides consulting, training, and access to resources; and the "Spirit of the Entrepreneur" event held recently at the Riverside Convention Center to celebrate the best entrepreneurs of the region. Examples such as these have enabled Riverside in past years to be ranked one of the "best-connected cities in the U.S." (Source: "State of the Internet" report by Akamai Technologies), and Intelligent Community of the Year 2013 (source: Intelligent Communities Forum). In 2014 the City received the "#5 Best Government Website" award by

Government Technology. And more recently (2015) Riverside received 6th place in the Digital cities Awards from the Center for Digital Government and the 2015 Harvard Innovation Award for Mobile Applications. But do Riverside residents and workers perceive the city as a “catalyst for innovation?”

Discovery and Entrepreneurship

Survey respondents were asked if they think Riverside is a good place to own or operate a business or non-profit, and about a quarter were unable to answer the question (a finding not unexpected since it is difficult to answer this question if one has never owned or operated a business/nonprofit, or if one doesn't have a close friend or family member who has). Focusing only on the results from those who *were* able to answer, we see that the vast majority of respondents to the statistically valid phone survey (**83.7%** -- up from **75.9%** in 2013) agreed (or strongly agreed) that Riverside is, indeed, a good place to own or operate a business or non-profit. There were no meaningful differences in results based on age, income, or educational attainment; however there was a statistically significant difference between the opinions of Hispanics vs. non-Hispanics. Specifically, **89.6%** of Hispanics agreed with the statement as opposed to **77.5%** of non-Hispanics.

Online survey results were different from phone survey figures. Specifically, 67.6% (up from 61.2% in 2013) of the *resident* online survey respondents and 84.2% (up from 70.4% in 2013) of the non-resident survey respondents who *work* in Riverside agreed that Riverside is a good place to own or operate a business or non-profit. As was noted earlier, when there are discrepancies in results, the phone survey must be taken as the most reliable and representative information.

But regardless of the survey modality, the bottom line is that most of the respondents felt that Riverside is a good place to own or operate a business or non-profit, and the numbers have improved significantly since the 2013 survey. Of course, it is always possible to do more to enhance the perception that Riverside is a “business-friendly” place.

Education and Workforce Development

Education and training are clearly important to Riverside residents and workers. In fact, when respondents were asked to name “the best things about living in Riverside” (an open-ended – not prompted – question), **8.7%** of phone survey respondents mentioned “good schools/universities.” And respondents to all versions of the Riverside Community Survey agree that it is important for young people to go to college or trade school.

They also rate Riverside’s K-12 system and college system relatively well (although one must note that answers to the online survey for those who work in Riverside but live elsewhere were most probably based on word of mouth rather than direct observation).

Further, virtually all online survey respondents (97.5% of residents and 97.7% of those who work in Riverside but live elsewhere) agree or strongly agree that there are good *colleges and universities* in Riverside.

As noted earlier, some survey questions were only asked of a particular profile of respondents. For example, only parents of children 18 years old or younger were asked more specific questions on the online survey regarding the quality of education in Riverside schools (since these people presumably have the most experience with the schools). When asked whether their child’s school prepares them for a good job or career, 76.4% strongly agreed or agreed. And 82.2% agreed that the child’s school prepares him or her to be a successful college student.

Obviously education does not stop after a person leaves the K-12 or college/university system. There are many public, non-profit, and private sector agencies which provide training and support to business and residents, all of which help to improve the city’s standing as a “business-friendly” place and a “catalyst for innovation.” Although business training and support are not “City services,” it might behoove the City to be more involved in promoting the services since 21.5% of residents and 12.6% of people who work in Riverside but live elsewhere didn’t know that Riverside had such services. Of the 113 people able to rate those services, only 50 said the services met their needs (41 said they “partially” met needs and 22 said they don’t

meet their needs). Suggestions for additional support services included: “Attention is paid to higher education, but can’t current businesses partner with the City to teach the basics like cooking, cleaning, and balancing checkbooks? Classes that used to be taught in school but now are not done,” “More affordable training options for students who aren’t drawn to college/university education,” and “Concisely written handbooks and instructions for operating a business in compliance with the regulations of the City.” The full array of comments has been provided to the City in an Excel file.

Finally, residents answering the online survey were asked whether they felt that Riverside’s workforce is properly trained and educated. Only about a third of respondents chose to answer that question, and of that group about two-thirds (64.4%) answered in the affirmative (with no meaningful significant differences noted in the responses by age, income, or educational attainment subgroup). The results are a bit better in the online survey of those who work in Riverside but live elsewhere...nearly three-quarters of the respondents (79.7% -- up from 73.2% in 2013) who were able to answer that question thought Riverside’s workforce is properly trained and educated.

4) **Intelligent growth – does Riverside embrace economic growth in a manner which promotes quality of life for its residents and workers?**

OVERVIEW: Objective data show that the job picture is improving in Riverside, and a majority of residents now think Riverside is a good place to find a good job and to start or grow a business. Riverside is perceived as an affordable place to live, a place where retail, restaurants, and parks and recreational spaces are all rated relatively well in terms of “meeting people’s needs.” Long-time Riverside residents acknowledge that air quality has improved. The car culture is alive and well in Riverside – most people rate a car or motorcycle as their 1st choice for traveling within the City, and a large portion of the residents and workers are unable to rate the ease of getting around by bike, bus or rail. Very few people have been willing to transition to an electric vehicle as an alternative to cars using “traditional” fuels.

Economy and jobs

It’s no secret that the recession hit hard in the Inland Empire in 2008, with the associated increase in unemployment. Over the past few years the economy has improved (although in “fits and starts”). For example, in April 2013 the unemployment rate in the Riverside-San Bernardino-Ontario MSA (Metropolitan Statistical Area) was 9.6%, whereas it was down to 6.1% in November 2015¹⁴ (6.0% in the City of Riverside¹⁵). Although the unemployment rate is

improving, it is still above California's unemployment rate of 5.7%¹⁶ and the nationwide unemployment rate of 5.0%.¹⁷ The economy is improving, but the lack of jobs is still an issue in Riverside.

What do City residents think about Riverside as a place to find a good job? A majority of phone survey respondents (**62.1%** -- up from **51.7%** in 2013) either strongly agreed or agreed that Riverside is a "good place to find a job." Although this year's figures are a significant improvement over the 2013 results, there is a need for further improvement in this area.

Anecdotal evidence from the online survey paints a slightly more pessimistic picture than phone survey results, although again this year's online figures are an improvement from the 2013 figures. Only 53.5% of online resident survey respondents (up from 44.6%) felt that Riverside is a good place to find a job. Further, only 50.0% of college students (up from 39.9% in 2013) expressed confidence that they will be able to find a good job in Riverside after graduation, another 31.3% (down from 43.9%) said that the jobs they want aren't in Riverside, and the remainder (18.8%) said they simply have no desire to stay in Riverside. This is a "brain drain" which Riverside cannot afford.

Internships or part-time jobs can be a good way of improving college students' chances of finding a good career position in Riverside, however only about a third of college students responding to the survey (32.7%) have sought such opportunities, and another 27.6% plan to do so in the future. A large portion of these students (56.9%) feel that there aren't enough local opportunities for internships or part-time jobs. Perhaps the City could serve as the intermediary between local businesses and area colleges/universities to increase the amount of opportunities for Riverside's college students.

Earlier, data were presented regarding Riverside as a place to own or operate an already existing business. Many people were unable to answer that question. Similarly, most of the online resident respondents were unable to evaluate whether Riverside is a "good place to start or grow a business," but of those who were able to respond, 64.2% answered in the affirmative. And 85.8% of those who work in Riverside but live elsewhere feel that way. Suggestions for making Riverside a better place to start or grow a business include: "A business incubator," "business incentives," "affordable licensing that would make the product/service pricing more affordable and appealing," and "less red tape."

Shifting the analysis from the "business" focus (Riverside residents as potential workers and employers) to Riverside residents as *consumers*, the question is: Do the City's businesses (specifically retail stores and restaurants) meet their needs? And if not, what could be done by the City to improve things? The following table shows responses from the phone survey and the

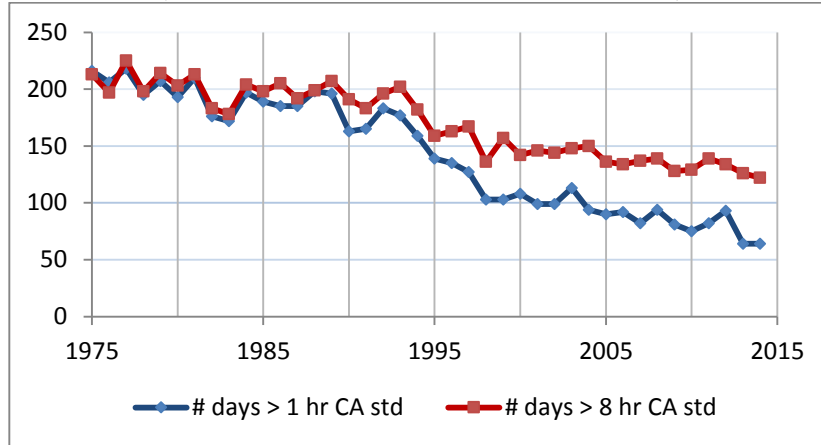
Respondents provided a “laundry list” of retail establishments and restaurants they would like to frequent in Riverside (the full list was provided to the City). It was interesting that many of the stores and restaurants mentioned by respondents already exist in Riverside! It would appear that people commented on the lack of particular stores/restaurants in their own immediate area/neighborhood rather than in the City as a whole. That said, respondents mentioned a desire for “Mom and Pop” stores and more “quality” stores for groceries, clothing, and furniture. They also want a Whole Foods market and “healthy food stores” such as Trader Joe’s. In terms of restaurants, people appear to want more “healthy food places” where there are vegan, gluten free, and organic options. They also want places where they can get ethnic food (e.g. Chinese, Vietnamese, Brazilian BBQ, Middle East, Thai, and sushi) and affordable, independently owned “Mom and Pop” places (i.e. fewer chains).

Environment and perceptions of recreational space

In the 1970’s when someone mentioned “Inland Empire,” one of the first things people thought of was “smog,” and that perception was warranted at the time. But over the past three decades, the air quality has dramatically improved as shown in the graph below portraying the number of days the city exceeded the maximum state 1-hour and 8-hour average ozone concentration.¹⁸

Even with objective improvement in air quality, people still perceive it as a significant problem in the region. In fact, **10.4%** of respondents mentioned smog and air pollution as the thing they like least about living in Riverside (an open-ended question for which people could mention up to 2 “negatives” about life in the City). But putting that number in perspective, **22.8%** mentioned traffic; **19.9%** mentioned weather, fires, floods, and earthquakes; and **11.9%** mentioned either crime/violence or gang activity or drugs as the thing they liked least about living in Riverside. When online survey respondents (residents) were presented with a list of potential answers from which they could select up to 2 options, 20.5% of online survey respondents selected air pollution (as opposed to 32.1% mentioning traffic, 23.5% selecting homelessness, and 29.7% selecting either drugs, crime/violence, or gang activity).

Yes, air quality is still perceived as a problem by a sizable group of people, but the question is: Do residents who have lived in Riverside for 6 or more years perceive that there has been an objective *improvement* over time? The answer, based on the phone survey results, is “yes.” Overall, six out of 10 (**60.3%**) of respondents agree or strongly agree that the air quality in Riverside has improved since they have lived in Riverside. Looking at some subgroupings of respondents, **54.4%** of the people who have lived in Riverside between 6 and 10 years have noticed an improvement, as have **52.0%** of people who have lived in Riverside between 11 and 20 years. But about two-thirds (**66.2%**) of the “long-time” residents (people who have been in Riverside more than 20 years – the people who are best in a position to make comparisons over time) feel that the air quality has improved since they’ve lived in Riverside.

With the improvement in air quality, one would think that people want to spend time outside in parks and recreational spaces. How do Riverside residents and workers rate those facilities?

The above ratings are relatively strong, and are consistent with the 2013 figures *other than* the stats for people who work in Riverside but live elsewhere which have improved significantly since the 2013 survey. Respondents did provide some comments to make parks/recreational spaces even better. Those comments revolved around the need for *more* parks, parks without the fear of encountering homeless individuals, safety and security in general, and the desire for more activities, equipment, and biking/hiking/jogging/walking trails.

Housing

Riverside County is one of the fastest growing regions in the country, and the City of Riverside is the largest city within the County. The growth rate in 2014 and 2015 was nowhere near the growth before the recession when the population increased 4 or 5 percent per year. But it is still growing quickly. Part of the reason for that growth has historically been job growth and the availability of affordable housing. According to a report by the California Association of Realtors, sales of existing single-family detached homes in the region rose 9.1% between March 2014 and March 2015¹⁹. And that growth is expected to continue throughout 2016 in the Riverside area due to job growth in warehousing, transportation, logistic, and manufacturing. The median sales price of existing detached homes in Riverside during the period from October 2015 to January 2016 was \$335,000²⁰, significantly lower than the \$475,990 for California and \$704,370 for Orange County, but higher than the overall Inland Empire figure of \$293,090.

The fact that Riverside is an affordable place to find a home (especially relative to Orange County or LA County) is no surprise to the **78.3%** of phone survey respondents (down from **85.1%** in 2013) and 74.9% of online resident respondents (down from 81.5% in 2013) who strongly agreed or agreed that Riverside is a good place to find an affordable place to live. There were no significant differences in opinion on that question based on age group. Even in the youngest age group (18 – 29 years old), **77.8%** find Riverside affordable. City leaders can make use of these statistics as they “market” Riverside to businesses considering relocating or expanding.

Mobility and transportation

As already noted in this report, traffic is considered to be the aspect of life in Riverside that people like least about the area, and that feeling has gotten worse since the 2013 report. Indeed, navigating the traffic in the City of Riverside (and in Southern California in general) is an ongoing challenge. Yet in order for residents and workers to be able to fully participate in society and enhance their quality of life, people need to be mobile.

As can be seen every weekday during rush hour, the car culture is alive and well in Riverside. But public transportation options also exist. The Riverside Transit Agency provides buses, trolleys, and dial-a-ride vehicles to serve people in cities throughout western Riverside County. The City provides “special transportation” to seniors and those with disabilities. And there are a variety of private organizations providing shuttle, taxi, or van service to Riverside residents and workers. Bike paths also provide circulation within the City.

Further, the City of Riverside is an active participant in the Riverside County Transportation Commission (RCTC). As noted on RCTC’s web site, “Getting to work and school or delivering goods and services may seem like simple daily activities but sometimes the routes we travel take decades of planning and hundreds of millions of dollars to implement. Since 1976, when RCTC was created by the state legislature, local voices have had an important and critical role in deciding our transportation future.” The City’s General Plan includes an acknowledgement of the importance of a “circulation and community mobility element” and addresses what it calls a “comprehensive approach to mobility.”

Some new questions were added to this year’s online survey to determine residents’ and workers’ preferred methods of travelling within the City of Riverside. The following table shows the results of a multiple response question for the residents asking: “Suppose you wanted to travel within the City of Riverside. Besides taking a personal vehicle, what would be your preferred method(s) of traveling?”²¹

The data show that many respondents (34.9%) did not feel that there was any viable option other than a personal vehicle for travelling within the City. Four out of ten people *did* list

walking as a method of travel, however that assumes that the places to which a person needs to travel are close to home or work. And a quarter of respondents said that their preferred method of travelling (other than a personal vehicle) would be bus or bicycle. About half of the few “other” choices were Uber or Lyft (actually a personal vehicle – just not one owned by the respondent).

But these data, although interesting, do not tell the full story. When online respondents were asked to rank preferred methods of travelling within the City without excluding a personal vehicle from consideration, the picture becomes clearer. A person’s own car or motorcycle is the first choice of the vast majority of people, with bus, bicycle, and walking seen as significantly lower priorities for travel. Streetcars were seen as a distant fourth or fifth choice.

Residents were also asked: “In the last few years was there ever a time when you couldn't do something you wanted to do in the City because you didn't have transportation?” Most (84.7%) said “no” or they “don't recall” (meaning that if it DID happen, it wasn't such an inconvenience that the event would have been retained in his/her memory). Of the 15.3% that said “yes,” the most-often mentioned factor that prevented the person from making the trip was not having a reliable personal vehicle. People also talked about the lack of available RTA bus service, and complained about freeway traffic and/or construction activity.

Only about a quarter (26.5%) of residents reported that they use public transportation within the City of Riverside. The predominant reason for not using public transportation (asked as a multiple response question) was “Don't know – I just like taking my personal vehicle” (43.6%) Yes, as indicated above, the car culture is alive and well! Other reasons for not using public transportation included:

- “Not convenient to get where I need to go” (32.6%)
- “Takes too long to get where I need to go” (30.8%)
- “I feel unsafe on buses” (24.7%) or “Don't like the people who use public transportation” (15.0%)
- “Have to wait too long for a bus” (18.8%) or “Buses don't operate at the times I need to travel” (11.3%)

Most respondents prefer using their own car to travel within the City, yet that brings up another “mobility” issue: parking. Residents were asked: “From your perspective, what are the main parking issues in downtown Riverside?” Nearly one in five people (19.2%) said that “there are no parking issues” they are aware of. Other responses include:

- “There isn’t enough parking on the street” (35.5%)
- “There isn’t enough “off-street” parking (i.e. parking garages or lots)” (30.6%)
- “Parking is too expensive” (28.9%)
- “The affordable parking is too far from where I need to go” (18.5%)

Some specific questions were asked to determine what Riverside residents think about the more “environmentally sound” ways of getting around town (i.e. availability of bike lanes and ease of travelling using public transportation). As seen in the tables below, a sizable group of residents was unable to rate these alternative modes of transportation. Those who *could* rate availability of bike lanes tended to give a rating of excellent or good, with somewhat higher ratings being given by the random sample of phone survey respondents than the respondents of the online survey. The ratings of ease of travelling by bus or rail were somewhat lower, especially in the online survey in which nearly half of respondents couldn’t answer the question, and those who could tended to rate “fair” or “poor” rather than “excellent” or “good.”

As might be expected, responses to these questions differed slightly by age. Whereas **27.2%** of phone survey respondents in the 18 – 29 age group rated availability of bike lanes as excellent, only **18.1%** of the 61 or older group did so. Similarly, **23.1%** of respondents in the

younger age group rated the ease of using bus or rail as “excellent,” whereas only **12.9%** of the seniors did so. The relative enthusiasm of young people is probably not surprising as discussed in an interesting report by the American Public Transportation Association.²² Among the key findings is that millennials are “multimodal” (that is, they choose between driving, transit, biking, or walking depending on the type of trip they need to take). They see transit as advantageous since they can work as they travel and appreciate the need to save money and to “save the environment.” These considerations apparently change as people progress through life stages.

Most of the online resident respondents (59.9%) indicated that they don’t walk or bike in the City when doing errands. Those who choose to walk or bike one or more times per week, on average, were asked how long it takes to make the round trip. About a quarter of those people (26.1%) said it takes less than 15 minutes (i.e. it is a very short trip). Another 44.6% said the round trip time is 15 to 30 minutes, and 29.3% said it takes more than 30 minutes, on average, to make the trip.

What can the City, County, or Regional Agencies do to encourage City residents and visitors to walk or bike more? The answers provided most often are to improve bike lane connectivity (30.5%), encourage schools to offer incentives or programs for children to walk and bike to school (27.3%), and install more sidewalks (26.9%). Another 18.2% said that there is *nothing* that would encourage increased walking or biking.

On another transportation-related topic: The City of Riverside has become involved in offering special local incentives to people who drive an electric vehicle as an alternative to “traditional” cars. And recently Riverside unveiled a state-of-the-art “fast electric vehicle charging station” at City Hall as an example of the City’s commitment to intelligent growth while being “green.”

City leaders were interested to find out via this survey about people’s attitudes regarding electric vehicles. The results: very few online survey respondents (3.8%) indicated that they (or someone in their household) drive an electric vehicle. Reasons offered for driving an electric vehicle include concern for the environment (37.5%), the desire to save money on gas (35.4%), and usage of the carpool lane for free (10.4%). The main reason offered for *not* driving such a vehicle is that their current car already meets their needs (39.0%). Another 30.9% expressed concerns about the price of the vehicle, and 9.7% said that the limitation on the number of miles one can drive before recharging is problematic. About half of respondents (52.3%) indicated that they would be *more likely* (however that is quantified) to drive an electric vehicle if more public charging stations were available (especially near shopping centers, grocery stores, and downtown), however it is a “chicken and egg” argument – for the most part, unless proactive steps (such as Riverside’s) are taken, charging stations won’t be made available until more

people buy electric vehicles, and people won't buy the vehicles until there are more charging stations.

CONCLUSION

- “I'm glad you created this survey to get people involved and get their input.”
- “Love riverside leadership for always looking for ways to make us shine. Love what is being done to make our city run smoothly in ALL areas. This survey is one of many ways Riverside listens and is attentive to our needs. I'm really appreciative.”
- “We are very proud to live in Riverside. We spend a lot of time downtown, our boys play little league here, our son is starting the police explorer program, and we have an awesome councilman. We are very excited about all the new planned developments, events and activities downtown and how it will improve the surrounding neighborhoods and property values.”
- “I love living in downtown Riverside. The historic buildings, restaurants, and community events are some of the main reasons my family decided to make Riverside home.”
- “You guys have made great improvements over the past few years in making Riverside ‘hip’ ...I wish I could work in Riverside and not have to commute to LA, but I have never been able to find work here....Keep up the great work.”
- “There are a lot of pros about living in Riverside, but my major cons are: (1) homelessness is really bad, (2) public transportation takes way too long to be efficient.
- “Great community.”

These are but a few of the concluding comments people made on this year's Riverside Community Quality of Life Survey effort. This survey, a follow-up of the 2013 survey, documents the good aspects of life in Riverside and demonstrates some of Riverside's challenges which need further attention from Riverside leaders and stakeholders.

As was the case in the 2013 Riverside Community Quality of Life Survey, Riverside is perceived as a good place to be active and healthy, to enjoy art and culture, to bring visitors, to find an affordable place to live, and to raise children. Riverside residents feel a tremendous sense of pride in their city, a sense of belonging. Awards and recognition for the City abounds, including designation by Forbes as “the eighth coolest city in America.”

That said there is still a great deal of work to be done before Riverside is a city where *all* residents have a safe and secure place to live and work. Riverside has its challenges, and we look forward to documenting progress on dealing with those challenges in the next Riverside Community Quality of Life Survey.

- The “simple” frequency tables below, produced by SPSS 22.0 (Statistical Package for the Social Sciences) are arranged showing 4 columns of numbers.
 - **Frequency** – the weighted number of respondents providing a particular response
 - **Percent** – the percentage of people providing a particular response, calculated as the frequency divided by 523 (that is, with “don’t know” and “refused” included in the totals)
 - **Valid Percent** – the percentage of people providing a particular response, with “don’t know” and “refused” *excluded* from the calculation
 - **Cumulative Percent** – the percentage of cases in each row including all previous rows. In many cases this column doesn’t have a meaningful interpretation. In others, such as number of years a person has lived in the City, it is meaningful to note that 4.6% have lived in the City less than 2 years, 13.8% 5 years or less, 25.6% 10 years or less, etc.

- For some questions, respondents had the opportunity to provide multiple answers (questions such as Q3, perceptions of the best things about living in the City). The tables for those multiple response questions show three columns of numbers:
 - **Responses, N** – The weighted number of respondents providing a particular response
 - **Responses, Percent** – the percentage of the total number of responses in a category, calculated as the N figure divided by the total number of responses to the question (the bottom of the “N” column).
 - **Percent of Cases** – the percentage of people who responded with a particular answer, calculated as the N figure divided by the total number of people who responded to the question with one or more answers

Riverside Community Quality of Life Survey Data Display, Online Survey for those who Live (and Perhaps Work) in Riverside

Following are frequency tables for the online version of the Riverside Community Quality of Life Survey for people who live (and perhaps work) in Riverside. A few comments about this data display are in order:

- Online surveys are a wonderful method of community engagement which can provide some interesting anecdotal data and can provide additional validation of phone survey results if the overall trends of the two methodologies match. They are NOT, however, random, thus results may be skewed and must be interpreted with caution. For example, online survey respondents tend to be those who are either extremely positive or extremely negative about the issue under study and are more motivated to complete a survey than those with “mid-range” attitudes. Further, people who complete online surveys tend to be younger, better educated, more affluent, and more likely to be employed. And Hispanics tend to be under-represented in surveys (both on-line and phone surveys). **The reader is encouraged to view the results of the statistically valid telephone survey in Appendix V.**
- The “simple” frequency tables below, produced by SPSS 22.0 (Statistical Package for the Social Sciences) are arranged showing 4 columns of numbers.
 - **Frequency** – the number of respondents providing a particular response
 - **Percent** – the percentage of people providing a particular response, calculated as the frequency divided by 1,483 (that is, with “don’t know” and “refused” included in the totals)
 - **Valid Percent** – the percentage of people providing a particular response, with “don’t know” and “refused” *excluded* from the calculation
 - **Cumulative Percent** – the percentage of cases in each row including all previous rows. In many cases this column doesn’t have a meaningful interpretation. In others, such as number of years a person has lived in the City, it is meaningful to note that 5.6% have lived in the City less than 2 years, 14.9% have lived in the City 5 years or less, 23.6% have lived in the City 10 years or less, etc.
- For some questions, respondents had the opportunity to provide multiple answers (questions such as Q3, perceptions of the best things about living in the City). The tables for those multiple response questions show three columns of numbers:
 - **Responses, N** – The weighted number of respondents providing a particular response
 - **Responses, Percent** – the percentage of the total number of responses in a category, calculated as the N figure divided by the total number of responses to the question (the bottom of the “N” column).
 - **Percent of Cases** – the percentage of people who responded with a particular answer, calculated as the N figure divided by the total number of people who responded to the question with one or more answers

Riverside Community Quality of Life Survey Data Display, Online Survey for those who Work (or Attend College/University) in Riverside but Live Elsewhere

Following are frequency tables for the online version of the Riverside Community Quality of Life Survey for people who work or attend college/university in Riverside but live elsewhere. A few comments about this data display are in order:

- Online surveys are a wonderful method of community engagement which can provide some interesting anecdotal data and can provide additional validation of phone survey results if the overall trends of the two methodologies match. They are NOT, however, random, thus results may be skewed and must be interpreted with caution. For example, online survey respondents tend to be those who are either extremely positive or extremely negative about the issue under study and are more motivated to complete a survey than those with “mid-range” attitudes. Further, people who complete online surveys tend to be younger, better educated, more affluent, and more likely to be employed. And Hispanics tend to be under-represented in surveys (both on-line and phone surveys). **The reader is encouraged to view the results of the statistically valid telephone survey in Appendix V.**
- The “simple” frequency tables below, produced by SPSS 22.0 (Statistical Package for the Social Sciences) are arranged showing 4 columns of numbers.
 - **Frequency** – the number of respondents providing a particular response
 - **Percent** – the percentage of people providing a particular response, calculated as the frequency divided by 216 (that is, with “don’t know” and “refused” included in the totals)
 - **Valid Percent** – the percentage of people providing a particular response, with “don’t know” and “refused” *excluded* from the calculation
 - **Cumulative Percent** – the percentage of cases in each row including all previous rows. In many cases this column doesn’t have a meaningful interpretation. In others, such as number of years a person has worked or attended college/university in the City, it is meaningful to note that 12.7% have worked/attended college in Riverside for less than 2 years, 26.9% 5 years or less, 55.2% 10 years or less, etc.
- For some questions, respondents had the opportunity to provide multiple answers (questions such as Q3, perceptions of the best things about living in the City). The tables for those multiple response questions show three columns of numbers:
 - **Responses, N** – The weighted number of respondents providing a particular response
 - **Responses, Percent** – the percentage of the total number of responses in a category, calculated as the N figure divided by the total number of responses to the question (the bottom of the “N” column).
 - **Percent of Cases** – the percentage of people who responded with a particular answer, calculated as the N figure divided by the total number of people who responded to the question with one or more answers

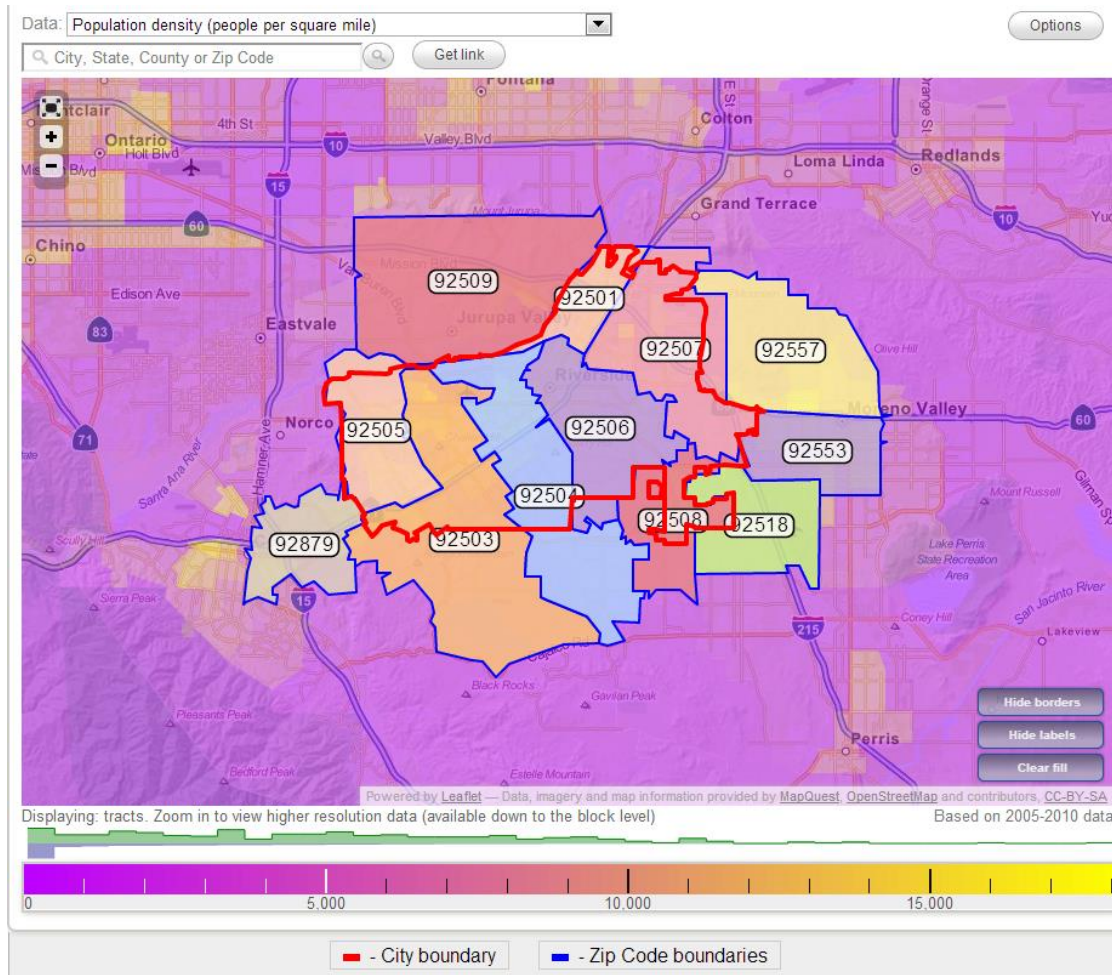
